
- 1 Title**

This order is the Diplomatic Privileges and Immunities (Extension of more favourable treatment) Order 2015.
- 2 Commencement**

This order is deemed to have come into force on 20 May 2015.
- 3 Extension of more favourable treatment**
 - (1) Subject to subsections (2) and (3) and for the purpose of giving effect to more favourable treatment than required under the Convention to the State(s) listed in the Schedule, as reciprocated by that State to the Cook Islands, it is declared that the mission of that State and its diplomats and consular officers are exempt from the prohibition on the importation of alcohol into the Cook Islands as unaccompanied goods.
 - (2) Alcohol may only be imported pursuant to subsection (1) if it meets the reasonable personal requirements of the diplomat or consular officer importing it, or it is clearly identified for official use by the mission.
 - (3) The Comptroller of Customs has the final authority to determine whether an importation meets either requirement under subsection (2).
