Mr Hindhaugh: States facts.

Lawson Ltd deals in gold. On 30 August⁶⁶ Lawson bought the gold for 22 dollars odd and placed it in a bottle with a screw top. It was not put immediately in the safe as it was to be shown to some geologists. It was overlooked and was not discovered missing till 6.9.66. The matter was reported to the Police. On the 7.9.66 the accused took a sample of gold to the geology department and said he had bought it on the market. ~~XXXXXXXXXXXX~~ The Senior geologist confirmed to the accused that it was gold and then accused went back to Lawson and offered it to him for sale. He said he was selling it for a friend. Lawson took the gold and sent for the Police. The accused under caution admitted the offence.

(Accused states facts correct).

Mr. Hindhaugh cont:

Accused is seventeen. He has no p.c.s and comes from Malaita. Four years schooling in an R.C. Mission school. He left at end of 1964. He came to Honiara. He worked with PWD for four months, then in the R.C. Mission for five months. He joined Lawson's firm in March 66 at a salary of \$20 per month as an office orderly.

His parents are alive and live in Malaita. He has been living with a cousin in Honiara. His parents are farmers and grow some copra for cashing.

Sentence:

Bound over for twelve months to be of good behaviour and keep peace.
