KING'S REGULATION

TO AMEND THE NEW HEBRIDES (LABOUR)
REGULATION 1913.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the New Hebrides in accordance with the provisions of the New Hebrides Order in Council, 1911.

In the name of His Majesty, George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India.

1. This Regulation may be cited for all purposes as the New Hebrides Labour (Amendment) Regulation, 1914.

2. Section nineteen of the New Hebrides Labour Regulation 1913 is hereby amended and shall be read and construed as if the second proviso appearing therein were repealed and the proviso following were substituted therefor:—

“Provided also that no British subject shall employ any male native under the age of sixteen years or any female native save and except any male native over the age of fourteen years or any adult female native for domestic service and under the conditions laid down in Article LV (1) of the Convention.”

Amendment of section 19 of King's Regulation No. I of 1913.
