KING'S REGULATION

TO PROVIDE FOR THE ACQUISITION AND GRANTING OF
TIMBER RIGHTS BY THE RESIDENT COMMISSIONER
IN THE BRITISH SOLOMON ISLANDS PROTECTORATE.

Made by His Britannic Majesty's High Commissioner for the
Western Pacific under the provisions of the Pacific Order in
Council 1893.

In the name of His Majesty, GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of
God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland
and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender
of the Faith, Emperor of India.

[30th June, 1922.]

1. This Regulation may be cited for all purposes as the Solomons Timber Regulation 1922, and shall be read and construed with the Solomons Timber Regulation, 1913. SHORT TITLE AND CONSTRUCTION.
2. It shall be lawful for the Resident Commissioner on behalf of the Protectorate Government to acquire from the owner of any land in the Protectorate or from any person entitled to cut and fell timber on such land on payment of such compensation as may be agreed upon between the Resident Commissioner and such owner or person the right to cut and fell and remove timber trees growing on such land. ACQUISITION OF TIMBER RIGHTS BY THE RESIDENT COMMISSIONER.
3. Where the Resident Commissioner has acquired rights under the last preceding section over any land he shall have power to grant to any person the right to cut and fell and remove timber trees growing on such land on such terms and conditions as to him may seem proper. GRANTING OF TIMBER RIGHTS BY THE RESIDENT COMMISSIONER.
