

PUBLIC LAW NO. 13-66

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 13-36, as amended, by amending sections 2, 3 and 4 thereof to change the use of certain funds appropriated therein, by amending section 5 thereof to change the allottee of certain funds, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 13-36, as amended by
2 Public Law No. 13-49, is hereby further amended to read as
3 follows:

4 "Section 2. The sum of \$400,000, or so much thereof as
5 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
6 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for
7 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004, to provide
8 funding for social and economic development projects in
9 the State of Yap. The funds appropriated under this
10 section shall be apportioned as follows:

11 (1) Post-secondary scholarships for Yapese students,
12 subject to the following conditions:

13 (a) funds appropriated under this subsection may
14 only be used for tuition, books, and on-campus room and
15 board expenses;

16 (b) the maximum amount available to any
17 individual student enrolled at an institution of higher
18 education located outside the FSM is \$7,000;

1 (c) the maximum amount available to any
2 individual student enrolled at the College of Micronesia
3 is \$1,500; and

4 (d) if the FSM Scholarship Board does not meet to
5 award scholarship funds appropriated by this section,
6 the Secretary of the FSM Department of Health, Education
7 and Social Affairs (HESA), or his designee, and the Yap
8 State member of the FSM Scholarship Board may determine
9 the recipients of such funds\$ 180,000

10 (2) Fuel and other provisions for travel
11 by FSM government officials to Yap State Outer
12 Islands 28,000

13 (3) Yap State Copra subsidies 50,000

14 (4) Yap Network Newspaper equipment 20,000

15 (5) Yap Delegation office construction,
16 renovation and operations and/or emergency/
17 disaster relief 100,000

18 (6) Construction and renovation of
19 Delegation Office 10,000

20 (7) Yap Delegation office-new
21 vehicle 12,000"

22 Section 2. Section 3 of Public Law No. 13-36, as amended by
23 Public Law No. 13-49, is hereby further amended to read as
24 follows:

25 "Section 3. The sum of \$800,000, or so much thereof as

1 may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
 2 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for
 3 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004, to provide
 4 funding for social and economic development projects in
 5 the State of Pohnpei. The funds appropriated under this
 6 section shall be apportioned as follows:

2 "Section 4. The sum of \$1,200,000, or so much thereof
 3 as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated from the
 4 General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for
 5 the fiscal year ending September 30, 2004, to provide
 6 funding for social and economic development projects in
 7 the State of Chuuk. The funds appropriated under this
 8 section shall be apportioned as follows:

8 Section 4. Section 5 of Public Law No. 13-36, as amended by
9 Public Law No. 13-49, is hereby further amended to read as
10 follows:

11 "Section 5. Allotment and management of funds and lapse
12 date.

13 (1) All funds appropriated by this act shall be allotted, mana
14 allottee of the funds appropriated under sections 1, 2
15 and 3 of this act shall be the President of the
16 Federated States of Micronesia or his designee, except
17 that the allottee of the funds appropriated under
18 subsections 1(1), 1(3) and 1(4) of this act shall be the
19 Governor of the State of Kosrae; the allottee of the
20 funds appropriated under sections 2(3) and 2(4) of this
21 act shall be the Governor of the State of Yap; the
22 allottee of the funds appropriated under sections 2(5)
23 and 2(6) shall be the Speaker of Congress; the allottee
24 of the funds appropriated under subsection 3(2) (a) (i)
25 shall be the mayor of Kolonia Town; the allottee of the

1 funds appropriated under subsections 3(2)(a)(ii),
2 3(2)(a)(iv) and 3(2)(a)(v) shall be the Sokehs
3 magistrate; the allottee of the funds appropriated under
4 subsection 3(2)(a)(iii) shall be the mayor of Nukuoro;
5 and the allottee of funds appropriated under subsection
6 3(2)(c)(v) shall be the Pohnpei Transportation
7 Authority.

8 The allottee of the funds appropriated under section 4
9 of this act shall be the Chuuk State Commission on
10 Improvement Projects, except that the funds appropriated
11 under section 4(1)(c) of this act shall be allotted to
12 the President of the Federated States of Micronesia.

13 (2) The allottees of the funds appropriated herein
14 shall be responsible for ensuring that these funds, or
15 so much thereof as may be necessary, are used solely for
16 the purpose specified herein, and shall report back to
17 the Congress on the status of these funds no later than
18 September 30, 2005. The authority of the allottees to
19 obligate such funds shall not lapse until fully
20 expended."

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2 Section 5. This act shall become law upon approval by the
3 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
4 becoming law without such approval.
