

AN ACT

To further amend sections 3, 4 and 5 of Public Law No. 17-68, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 17-71 and 17-81, for the purpose of changing the use of certain funds previously appropriated to fund public projects and social programs in the States of Kosrae, Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 3 of Public Law No. 17-68, as amended
2 by Public Laws Nos. 17-71, is hereby further amended to read as
3 follows:

4 "Section 3. Of the sum of \$5,697,383 appropriated by
5 this act, \$15,197 is apportioned to pay the amount
6 owed by the State of Kosrae to FEMA and \$600,000 is
7 apportioned for public projects and social programs
8 in the State of Kosrae.

9 "Section 5. Of the sum of \$5,697,383 appropriated by
10 this act, \$978,860 is apportioned to pay the amount owed
11 by the State of Chuuk to FEMA and \$1,800,000 is
12 apportioned for public projects and social programs.
