

AN ACT

To further amend sections 2, 3, 5 and 6 of Public Law No. 17-68, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 17-71, 17-81, 17-84, 17-89 and 17-90, for the purpose of changing the use and allottee of certain funds previously appropriated to fund public projects and social programs in the States of Yap, Kosrae and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 17-68, as amended by  
2 Public Law No. 17-71, is hereby further amended to read as  
3 follows:

4 "Section 2. Of the sum of \$5,697,383 appropriated by  
5 this act, \$284,210 is apportioned to pay the amount owed  
6 by the State of Yap to FEMA and \$600,000 is apportioned  
7 for public projects and social programs in the State of  
8 Yap.

9 (1) Amount owed by the State of Yap to FEMA PROVIDED  
10 THAT this amount shall be deemed an advance. The  
11 repayment of which shall be directed to the following  
12 projects:

 7 this act, \$978,860 is apportioned to pay the amount owed  
 8 by the State of Chuuk to FEMA and \$1,800,000 is  
 9 apportioned for public projects and social programs.

1 Section 4. Section 6 of Public Law No. 17-68, as amended by  
2 Public Law No. 17-71, is here by further amended to read as  
3 follows:

4 "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse  
5 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
6 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
7 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not  
8 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The  
9 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these  
10 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used  
11 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that  
12 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum  
13 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated  
14 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap  
15 State. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
16 sections 3 and 4 of this act shall be the President of  
17 the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee,  
18 EXCEPT THAT the allottee of funds appropriated under  
19 subsection 1 of section 3 and subsections 3(2)(j), (k),  
20 (l), (m), (n), (o), (q), (r), (s), (t), (u), (v), (w),  
21 (x), (y), (z), (aa), (ab), (ac), (ad), (ae), (af), (ag)  
22 and ah of this act shall be the Governor of Kosrae  
23 State, the allottee of funds appropriated under  
24 subsection 3(2)(p) of this act shall be the Mayor of  
25 Lelu Municipal Government or his designee and the

1 allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 1 of  
2 section 4 of this act shall be the Governor of Pohnpei  
3 State. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
4 subsection 5(1) of this act shall be the President of  
5 the Federated States of Micronesia or his designee. The  
6 allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(2) (a)  
7 of this act shall be the Governor of Chuuk State or his  
8 designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
9 subsection 5(2) (b) of section 5 of this act shall be the  
10 Mortlock Islands Development Authority. The allottee of  
11 funds appropriated under subsection 5(2) (d) of section 5  
12 of this act shall be the Southern Namoneas Development  
13 Authority or its designee. The allottee of funds  
14 appropriated under subsection 5(2) (e) of section 5 of  
15 this act shall be the Faichuk Development Authority or  
16 its designee. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
17 subsection 5(2) (f) of this act shall be the Northwest  
18 Island Development Authority. The authority of the  
19 allottee to obligate funds appropriated by this act  
20 shall lapse on September 30, 2014.”

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1 Section 5. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon it  
3 becoming law without such approval.
