

AN ACT

To further amend Public Law No. 18-35, as amended by Public Law No. 18-49, by amending sections 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 thereof, to change the use and allottee of funds previously appropriated therein to fund public projects and social programs for the people of Yap, Kosrae, Pohnpei and Chuuk, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1           Section 1. Section 2 of Public Law No. 18-35 as amended by

13 Section 5. Section 6 of Public Law No. 18-35, as amended by  
14 Public Law No. 18-49, is hereby further amended to read as  
15 follows:

16 "Section 6. Allotment and management of funds and lapse  
17 date. All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
18 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
19 accordance with applicable laws, including, but not  
20 limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979. The  
21 allottee shall be responsible for ensuring that these  
22 funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used  
23 solely for the purpose specified in this act, and that  
24 no obligations are incurred in excess of the sum  
25 appropriated. The allottee of the funds appropriated  
26 under section 2 of this act shall be the Governor of Yap

1 State provided that the allottee of funds appropriated  
2 under section 2(e) shall be the President of COM-FSM.  
3 The allottee of funds appropriated under sections 3 and  
4 4 of this act shall be the President of the Federated  
5 States of Micronesia or his designee, EXCEPT THAT the  
6 allottee of funds appropriated under subsections (3)(a),  
7 (b), (c), (d), (e), (f), (g), (h), (i), (j), (k), (l),  
8 (m), (n), (o), (p), (q), (r), (s), (t), (u), (v), (w),  
9 (x), (y) and (aq) of section 3 of this act shall be the  
10 Mayor of Lelu Town Government; the allottee of funds  
11 appropriated under subsections 4(3)(a), 4(3)(b) and  
12 4(3)(e) of section 4 of this act shall be the Pohnpei  
13 Transportation Authority and the allottee of funds  
14 appropriated under subsection (4)(3)(y) of section 4 of  
15 this act shall be the Luhkonmoanlap of Kitti Municipal  
16 government. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
17 subsections 5(1) and 5(3) of this act shall be the  
18 Governor of Chuuk State or his designee. The allottee  
19 of funds appropriated under subsection 5(2) of this act  
20 shall be the Mortlock Islands Development Authority.  
21 The allottee of funds appropriated under subsection 5(4)  
22 of this act shall be the Southern Namoneas Development  
23 Authority. The allottee of funds appropriated under  
24 subsection 5(5) of this act shall be the Faichuk  
25 Development Authority. The allottee of funds  
26 appropriated under subsection 5(6) of this act shall be

1           the General Manager of the Northwest Island Development  
2           Authority. The authority of the allottee to obligate  
3           funds appropriated by this act shall lapse on September  
4           30, 2015.”

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12           Section 6. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
13           President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its  
14           becoming law without such approval.
