

AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 20-54, 20-64 and 20-67, in order to appropriate \$1,445,693 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, to deappropriate \$20,000 of funds from a particular line item, to clarify the intended use of funds for a particular line item, to designate certain allottees for multiple line items, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 20-42, as amended by
2 Public Law No. 20-54, is hereby further amended to read as
3 follows:

4 "Section 1. Purpose. The purpose of this act is to
5 appropriate the sum of \$83,554,726 from the General Fund
6 of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal
7 year ending September 30, 2018, for the purpose of
8 funding the operations of all branches of the National
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources
12 Development. The National Government's share of the
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT
14 THAT; the National Government will retain 10 percent of
15 the Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected
16 in the budget for the Department of Education. The sum
17 appropriated herein shall be apportioned as follows:"

 24 by Public Laws Nos. 20-64 and 20-67, is hereby further amended

1 Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and Lapse
2 Dates.

3 (1) General provisions.

4 (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be
5 allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in accordance
6 with applicable law, including, but not limited to, the Financial
7 Management Act of 1979.

8 (b) The allottees shall be responsible for ensuring
9 that these funds, or so much thereof as may be necessary, are used
10 solely for the purposes specified in this act, and that no
11 obligations are incurred in excess of the sums appropriated.

12 (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds appropriated by
13 this act are as follows:

14 (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
15 President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

16 (b) Section 3 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
17 Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States of Micronesia;

18 (c) Section 4 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
19 Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of the Federated States of
20 Micronesia;

21 (d) Section 5 - the allottee of these funds shall be the
22 Public Auditor of the Federated States of Micronesia;

23 (e) Sections 6 through 9 - the allottee of these funds
24 shall be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;

25 PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that for the following subsections of sections

1 8 through 9 of this act:

2 (i) Section 8(1)(g) – the allottee of these funds shall
3 be the Chair of the Joint Committee on Compact Review and
4 Planning;

5 (ii) Section 8(9) – the allottee of these funds shall
6 be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States of
7 Micronesia;

8 (iii) Section 8(12)(a) – the allottee of these funds
9 shall be the President of the College of Micronesia-FSM;

10 (iv) Section 8(12)(e) through (h) – the allottee of
11 these funds shall be the Chief Justice of the respective State
12 Supreme Court;

13 (v) Section 9(1) – the allottee of these funds shall be
14 the President of the College of Micronesia-FSM;

15 (vi) Section 9(16)(a) – the allottee of these funds
16 shall be the President of the Federated States of Micronesia;
17 EXCEPT THAT, for the share of funds from this line item for the
18 Conservation Society in Chuuk, the allottee shall be the Governor
19 of the State of Chuuk, AND, for the share of funds from this line
20 item for the Conservation Society in Yap, the allottee shall be
21 the Governor of the State of Yap, AND, for the share of funds from
22 this line item for the Conservation Society in Kosrae, the
23 allottee shall be the Kosrae Civil Society;

24 (vii) Section 9(16)(f) – the allottee of these funds
25 shall be the Governor of the State of Yap;

1 (viii) Section 8(12)(v) through (y) – the allottee of
2 these funds shall be the Governor of the respective State.

3 (ix) Section 8(6)(j) – the allottee of funds
4 shall be the FSM Embassy, Beijing, China;

5 (x) Section 8(6)(k) – the allottee of these
6 funds shall be the FSM Embassy, Suva, Fiji;

7 (xi) Section 8(12)(z) – the allottee of these
8 funds shall be the Governor of the State of Yap.

9 (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to obligate
10 funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as of September 30,
11 2018; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds appropriated under section
12 9 of this act shall not lapse.”

13 Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the
14 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its
15 becoming law without such approval.
