**PUBLIC LAW NO. 21-171**

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AN ACT

To amend sections 1, 2, 3, 8, 9 and 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116 and 21-147, to appropriate \$1,166,314 of additional funds from the General Fund of the Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2020, in order to provide supplemental funding for the operations of the National Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by  
2 Public Law Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116, and 21-147 is hereby  
3 further amended to read as follows:

4 "Purpose. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the  
5 sum of \$73,475,575, from the General Fund of the  
6 Federated States of Micronesia for the fiscal year  
7 ending September 30, 2020, for the purpose of funding  
8 the operations of all branches of the National  
9 Government of the Federated States of Micronesia, its  
10 agencies, various programs, grants, subsidies and  
11 contributions and Capital and Human Resources  
12 Development. The National Government's share of the  
13 Amended Compact funds has been reduced to zero; EXCEPT  
14 THAT; the National Government will retain the Compact  
15 Sector Grant amount for COM-FSM and 10 percent of the  
16 Supplemental Education Grant funds as is reflected in  
17 the budget for the Department of Education. The sum

25 Section 6. Section 12 of Public Law No. 21-42, as amended by

1 Public Laws Nos. 21-55, 21-77, 21-94, 21-116 and 21-147 is hereby  
2 further amended to read as follows:

3           "Section 12. Allotment and Management of Funds and  
4           Lapse Dates.

5           (1) General provisions.

6           (a) All funds appropriated by this act shall be  
7           allotted, managed, administered and accounted for in  
8           accordance with applicable law, including, but not  
9           limited to, the Financial Management Act of 1979.

10           (b) The allottees shall be responsible for  
11           ensuring that these funds, or so much thereof as may be  
12           necessary, are used solely for the purposes specified in  
13           this act, and that no obligations are incurred in excess  
14           of the sums appropriated.

15           (2) Allottees. The allottees of the funds  
16           appropriated by this act are as follows:

17           (a) Section 2 - the allottee of these funds shall

20           be the Speaker of the Congress of the Federated States

6 subsections of sections 8 through 9 of this act:

7 (i) Sections 8(1)(f) and 8(13)(q) - the  
8 allottee of these funds shall be the Chair of the Joint  
9 Committee on Compact Review and Planning;

10 (ii) Section 8(8)(a) - the allottee of these  
11 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

12 (iii) Section 8(8)(b) - the allottee of these  
13 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Pohnpei;

14 (iv) Section 8(8)(c) - the allottee of these  
15 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

16 (v) Section 8(8)(d) - the allottee of these  
17 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

18 (vi) Section 8(11) - the allottee of these  
19 funds shall be the Public Auditor of the Federated  
20 States of Micronesia;

21 (vii) Section 8(12) - the allottee of these  
22 funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the  
23 Federated States of Micronesia;

24 (viii) Section 8(13)(a) - the allottee of these  
25 funds shall be the President of the College of

1           Micronesia-FSM;

2                   (ix) Section 8(13)(d) through (g) - the  
3 allottee of these funds shall be the Chief Justice of  
4 the respective State Supreme Court;

5                   (x) Section 8(13)(h) - the allottee of these  
6 funds shall be the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of  
7 the Federated States of Micronesia;

8                   (xi) Section 9(1) - the allottee of these  
9 funds shall be the President of the College of  
10 Micronesia-FSM;

11                   (xii) Section 9(3)(b) - the allottee of these  
12 funds shall be the Governor of the state of Kosrae;

13                   (xiii) Section 9(3)(c) - the allottee of  
14 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of  
15 Pohnpei;

16                   (xiv) Section 9(3)(d) - the allottee of  
17 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Chuuk;

18                   (xv) Section 9(3)(e) - the allottee of  
19 these funds shall be the Governor of the state of Yap;

20                   (xvi) Section 9(11)(b) - the allottee of  
21 these funds shall be the Speaker of the Congress of the  
22 Federated States of Micronesia;

23                   (xvii) Section 9(11)(f)- the allottee of  
24 these funds shall be the Governor of the State of Chuuk;

25                   (xviii) Section 8(13)(t) - the allottee of

1           these funds shall be the National Olympic Committee;

2                           (xix) Section 8(13)(u) – the allottee of  
3           these funds shall be the Principal of Saint Cecilia  
4           Catholic School;

5                           (xx) Section 9(11)(d) – the allottee of  
6           these funds shall be the President of the Constitutional  
7           Convention.

8                           (xxi) Section 9(11)(g) – the allottee of  
9           these funds shall be the Secretary of the Department of  
10          Transportation, Communications, and Infrastructure.”

11           (3) Lapse date. The authority of the allottees to  
12          obligate funds appropriated by this act shall lapse as  
13          of September 30, 2020; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, that the funds  
14          appropriated under section 9 of this act shall not  
15          lapse.”

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1           Section 7. This act shall become law upon approval by the  
2 President of the Federated States of Micronesia or upon its  
3 becoming law without such approval.
