AN ACT

To amend title 12 of the Code of the Federated States of Micronesia by amending section 1202 to place extradition and transfer of prisoners within the scope of joint law enforcement agreements, and for other purposes.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CONGRESS OF THE FEDERATED STATES OF MICRONESIA:

1 Section 1. Section 1202 of title 12 of the Code of the Federated 2 States of Micronesia is hereby amended to read as follows: "Section 1202. Joint administration of law enforcement 3 4 functions. The President of the Federated States of Micronesia 5 may authorize appropriate State government officials to act on behalf of the National Government in performing the following б law enforcement functions: 8 (1) detection and prevention of National offenses; 9 arrest and detention of persons having committed or 10 being charged with a National offense; 11 (3) investigation and prosecution of criminal cases in-12 volving the commission of a National offense; (4) providing legal defense and assistance to persons 13 14 being prosecuted for a National offense; (5) incarceration of persons convicted of a National 15 16 offense and under a sentence of imprisonment; 17 (6) granting of parole to persons convicted of a 18 National offense and eligible under applicable laws for parole 19 from a sentence of imprisonment; 20 (7) probation and parole supervision over persons 21 serving a penal sentence following conviction of a National 22 offense; and
