5	(a) in accordance with Article VIII, Section 8 of the Constitution for a Supplemental
6	Appropriation, from the Marshall Islands General Fund, from donor grants and donor project
7	support, a total sum of \$30,921,605; to meet certain special appropriations and capital
8	expenditures of the Government as set out in Schedule 1, 2 and 3 of this Act.
9	(b) for delegation of approved expenditure under Section 5 of Article VIII of the
10	Constitution; and
11	(c) for control on reprogramming and transfer of funds within program areas.

13 14 15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE NITIJELA OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE MARSHALL ISLANDS:
16	Section 1. Short title.
17	This Act may be cited as the Fiscal Year 2013 Supplemental Appropriation Act, 2013.
18	
19	Section 2. Statement of National Objective.
20	It is the intention of the Government of the Republic of the Marshall Islands to hereby
21	enact and implement a supplemental appropriation, to authorize certain special appropriations
22	and capital expenditures over and above that which was authorized by P.L.2012-3, in the manner
23	set out in Schedules attached as Appendix A to this Act.
24	
25	Section 3. Interpretation.
26	In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires:

1 (a) "program area" means the program areas set out in Schedule 1 below.

#### Section 4. Appropriation from the Marshall Islands General Fund.

A total sum of \$5,300,000 is hereby appropriated, and may be withdrawn from the

Marshall Islands General Fund and expended pursuant to Article VIII of the Constitution for

6 program areas as set out in Schedule 1.

#### Section 5. Appropriation of other funds.

A total sum of **S925,500** is hereby appropriated, being the total revenue provided as grants by the U.S. Department of Interior Grant, Asian Development Bank Grant (Coconut Replanting), and UNDP (ADMIRE) and shall be credited to the National Treasury and shall be appropriated in accordance with the relevant provisions and Schedule 2.

#### Section 6. Appropriation of Donor Project Support.

A total sum of \$24,696,105 is hereby appropriated, being the total sum of donors project support by the United Nations, European Union, World Bank, Australia and Japan, shall not be available for expenditure as reprogrammed expenditure under Article VIII Section 7 of the Constitution, except as authorized by or under the agreements with the donor nation and/or institution, and schedule 3.

#### Section 7. Funding of the Office of the Auditor General.

The Secretary of Finance shall withhold and deposit in the special account in the Marshalls Islands General Fund, one eighth percent (0.8%) of all amounts appropriated in

(a) the purpose of the appropriation are satisfied, or

(b) the funds are expended,

3	Section 11. Delegation of Authority
4	(1) For the purpose of Article VIII, Section 5(1) of the Constitution, the authority to
5	approve expenditure in a program area in accordance with Schedule 1, is hereby delegated to:
6	(a) The member of the Cabinet primarily responsible for that program area and;
7	(b) If the responsible member of the Cabinet so directs by instrument in writing,
8	and subject to any limitations imposed by the instrument and to general control by the
9	member, an appropriate person, authority, or agency; or subject in either case to any
10	limitations imposed by the Cabinet.
11	(2) Any expenditure otherwise than in accordance with Schedules 1, 2 and 3 shall require
12	the approval of the Cabinet in accordance with Article VIII, Section 5(1) of the Constitution.
13	(3) Any expenditure for prior year liabilities made under schedule 1 shall not be available
14	for expenditure as reprogrammed expenditure but shall be withheld and paid directly by the
15	Secretary of Finance to the vendor or service provider.
16	
17	Section 12. Budget Estimates and Statement.
18	(1) The Budget Estimates for expenditures for the relevant program areas are set out in
19	Schedules 1, 2 and 3 of this Act.
20	(2) The Budget Statement from the Minister of Finance is attached as Appendix B to this
21	Act.
22	
23	Section 13. Reprogramming and Transfers

1	No funds may be reprogrammed or transferred to any other program areas or disbursed in
2	any other manuer except as set out in Schedule 1 of this Act.
3:	
4	Section 14. Effective Date.
5 <sup>-</sup>	This Act shall come into effect on the date of certification in accordance with Article IV
6	Section 21 of the Constitution and Rules of Procedures of the Nitijela.
