## ADMINISTRATION HOSPITAL REGULATIONS

Pursuant to the powers conferred by section four of the Native Administration Ordinance 1922, I, Frederick Royden Chalmers, the Administrator of the Island of Nauru, hereby make the following Regulations.

## ADMINISTRATION HOSPITAL REGULATIONS

- Short title | 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Administration Hospital Regulations.
- Commence- 2. These Regulations shall come into operation on the ment Sixteenth day of March, 1940.
- Repeal.

  3. The Administration Hospital Regulations made on the 28th day of October, 1939 are repealed.
- Defini- 4. In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention tions. appears -

"hospital" means the hospital conducted by the Administration and includes the hospital grounds;

"in-patient" means a native in-patient of the hospital;

"medical officer" means the medical officer in charge of the hospital; "out patient" means a native out-patient of the hospital.

- OutPatients.

  5. Except in the case of emergency, the hours for attendance at the hospital by out-patients shall be from 8.30 a.m. to 10a.m. daily.
- In-patients. 6.- (1) Each in-patient shall provide his own sleeping materials and eating utensils.
  - (2) An in-patient shall not leave the hospital unless the permission of the medical officer has first been obtained.
  - (3) Permission to leave the hospital shall be applied for -
    - (a) in the case of morning leave on the morning previous to the morning on which leave is desired; and
    - (b) in any other case on the morning of the day on which leave is desired.
  - (4.) An in-patient whom the medical officer certifies to be fit to perform light duties, shall, on being so required by the medical officer or sister in charge at the hospital assist in maintaining the hospital grounds in a clean and tidy condition.

Caretaker. 7.- (1.) Except with the permission of the medical officer, an in-patient shall have one caretaker only.

(2) Caretakers when off dutyshall not, except as authorize by the medical officer, remain in the hospital.

Visitors.

8.- (1.) Except with permission from the medical officer or sister in charge, a person shall not enter the hospital for the purpose of visiting a patient except during the visiting hours which shall be as follows:-

From 6 a.m. to 7 a.m.; From 4 p.m. to 6p. m.; and From 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.

- (2) A visitor shall not remain in a ward -
- (a) when the medical officer is examining a patient in that ward; or
- (b) after being requested by the medical officer, sister in charge, native medical practitioner or orderly to leave that ward.

Food etc. for pat-: ients.

- 9.- (1) Food and articles for patients may be delivered to the sister in charge at the hespital at any reasonable time.
- (2) The person conveying the food or articles shall, unless the delivery is effected during visiting hours, depart immediately after its delivery.

Latrines. 10. A person using the hospital latrines shall not misuse the latrine accommodation.

Depositing 11. A person shall not deposit rubbish, fefuse, rags, rubbish an papers or other litter in the hospital, elsewhere than in offence. receptacles provided for that purpose.

Damaging 12. A person shall not climb upon any fence, building, water tower or other erection or apparatus of the hospital. property.

Hanging washing on fence. 13. A person shall not hang washing on the fence of the hospital.

Trespassing.

14. A person shall not trespass on the hospital premises or grounds.

Straying 15. Any livestock found straying in the hospital grounds livestock. may be confiscated and destroyed by the medical officer and no compensation shall be payable to the owner of any livestock so destroyed.

Unseemly 16. A person shall not create or take part in any behaviour. disturb noe or conduct himself or herself otherwise than in a quiet and seemly manner while in the hospital.

Offences.

17.- (1) my pers n while introvenes or fails to comply with any provision of these regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding One pound or to imprisonment for seven days

or to imprisonment for seven days.

(2.) Where a patient is sentenced to imprisonment, the sentence shall be deferred until he is discharged from hospital and certified by the medical officer to be physically fit to

serve the sentence.
