GENERAL ANNOTATION.

ADMINISTRATION.

As at 13 February 1976 (the date of gazettal of the most comprehensive allocation of responsibilities to Ministers and Departments at about the effective date), while the administration of this Chapter was not vested specifically in any Minister, it appears from the determination of the functions of Departments that it probably came within the responsibility of the Department of Labour, Commerce and Industry¹.

The Chapter does not refer to "the Minister", "the Departmental Head" or "the Department."
