AN ORDINANCE

To Amend the "Customs Ordinance, 1909-1928."

**B**E it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Territory of Papua, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Papua Act, 1905-1934*, as follows:—

1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Customs Ordinance, 1939*. Short title and citation.

(2) The *Customs Ordinance, 1909-1928*, is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

(3) The Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the *Customs Ordinance, 1909-1939*.

2. Section One hundred and twenty-eight of the Principal Ordinance is repealed and the following inserted in lieu thereof:— Repeal and substitution of Section 128 of the Principal Ordinance

"Australian Currency."

"128. All duties shall be paid in Australian Currency."

**3.** Subsection (a) of Section One hundred and forty-four of the Principal Ordinance is amended by inserting immediately after the words "fair market value" the words "in Australian Currency."

**4.** Subsection (b) of Section One hundred and forty-four is amended by inserting the word "entry" immediately after the words "time of."

**5.** Section One hundred and forty-seven of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting the word "British" wherever occurring and inserting the word "Australian" in lieu thereof.

**6.** Section One hundred and fifty-two of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding the following new proviso:—

"Provided that the Lieutenant-Governor in Council may in regard to any particular goods or classes of goods extend the said period within which the goods are to be exported whereupon the period of retention of duty on deposit shall be extended accordingly."

Passed in Council this eleventh day of August, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine.
