## AN ORDINANCE

To Authorize the Appropriation of a Certain Further Sum towards the Service of the Period ended on the last day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight.

WHEREAS there has been expended for the Service Preamble. of the year from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, to the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, the sum of Twelve Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-eight Pounds for certain necessary Services in excess of the sums authorized by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1937-1938, to be expended for the said Services, which additional expenditure was not foreseen at the time of the

passing of the said Ordinance: And whereas it is desirable and necessary that such expenditure should be sanctioned by a further Appropriation: Be it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Territory of Papua, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Papua Act*, 1905-1934, as follows:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation Ordinance (No. 1), 1937-1938.

Expenditure £12,858 for year ended 30th June, 1938, sanctioned.

2. The issue and application of any sum or sums not exceeding Twelve Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty-eight Pounds to defray Supplementary charges for the Service of the year from the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-seven, to the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, the said Supplementary charges being for the Services enumerated in the Schedule hereto is hereby authorized and sanctioned notwithstanding that the same took place before the passing of this Ordinance.

Officers indemnified.

**3.** The Lieutenant-Governor and the Treasurer and all other officers are hereby indemnified against all claims and liabilities in respect of the issue and application of the said sums without the previous authority of an Appropriation Ordinance.

Receipts to be full discharge.

4. The Treasurer shall in his accounts be allowed credit for any sum or sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any Warrant of the Lieutenant-Governor in respect of any of the payments hereby authorized and the receipt or receipts of the respective persons to whom the same shall be so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his accounts for any such sum or sums as shall be therein mentioned and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
