AN ORDINANCE

To Amend the "Sago Ordinance, 1908-1920."

[Reserved 16th July, 1934; Assented to 16th August, 1934.] (a)

B^E it ordained by the Legislative Council for the Territory of Papua, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Papua Act*, 1905-1924, as follows:—

- 1. (1) This Ordinance may be cited as the Sago short title and Ordinance, 1934.
- (2) In this Ordinance the Sago Ordinance, 1908-1920, is referred to as the Principal Ordinance.
- (3) The Principal Ordinance as amended by this Ordinance may be cited as the Sago Ordinance, 1908-1934.
- 2. Section One of the Principal Ordinance is amend-Amendment of ed by omitting therefrom after the word "reserve" first Principal Ordinance. occurring all the words to the end of the section.

Amendment of s. 6 of Principal Ordinance.

3. Section Six of the Principal Ordinance is amended by omitting therefrom the words "Land in respect of which such rights as aforesaid have been acquired shall for the purposes of this Ordinance be deemed to be Crown lands" and inserting in lieu thereof the words "Licences to cut and remove the sago or native product may be granted in such manner and subject to such terms and conditions as may be prescribed by regulation."

Exclusive right to cut sago may be granted by Proclamation.

- 4. After Section Six of the Principal Ordinance the following new sections are inserted:—
 - "6A. The Lieutenant-Governor may by Proclamation in the *Gazette* grant to any person the exclusive right to apply for a sago licence within such area and during such period as may be described in the Proclamation and no person shall during that period approve any agreement to cut sago within that area."

"6B. A licensee may while engaged in cutting and removing sago cut and remove any indigenous tree or plant within the area included in his licence."

Passed in Council this sixteenth day of July, in the year of Our Lord One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

Assented to by His Excellency the Governor-General, with the advice of the Executive Council of the Commonwealth of Australia, on the sixteenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-four.

Licensee may cut and remove any indigenous tree or plant under certain circumstances.
