STATUTORY RULES. No. 5 of 1924.

REGULATIONS

Made under The Native Regulation Ordinance of 1908.

Native Regulations, 1922 (Statutory Rules No. 3 of 1922) are amended by inserting after Regulation 83 the following new regulation:—

Arson.

- "83A. (1) Any native who wilfully and unlawfully sets fire to—
 - (a) any native-owned building or structure whatever, whether completed or not;
 - (b) any native-owned cultivated garden;
 - (c) Any native-owned tree, palm or shrub, whether indigenous or cultivated, the vegetable produce of which is used by the natives for food:

shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding Three pounds and in default of payment to imprisonment for any period not exceeding six months, or to imprisonment in the first instance for any period not exceeding six months.

2. When a native is convicted of an offence as mentioned in the last preceding section the magistrate may discharge the offender without inflicting any punishment upon his making such compensation to the native aggrieved as may be approved by the magistrate."
