

LIQUOR (PAPUA) ORDINANCE 1951.⁽¹⁾

No. 21 of 1951.

An Ordinance to amend the Liquor Ordinance 1911-1950 of the Territory of Papua.

BE it ordained by the Administrator of the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, with the advice of the Federal Executive Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Papua and New Guinea Act 1949-1950*, as follows:—

1.—(1.) This Ordinance may be cited as the *Liquor (Papua) Ordinance 1951.*⁽¹⁾ Short title and citation.

(2.) The *Liquor Ordinance 1911-1950*⁽²⁾ of the Territory of Papua is in this Ordinance referred to as the Principal Ordinance.

PART B : LIQUOR—

(3.) The Principal Ordinance, as amended by this Ordinance, may be cited as the *Liquor Ordinance* 1911-1951.

Commencement. **2.** This Ordinance shall come into operation on a date to be fixed by the Administrator by notice in the *Gazette*.⁽¹⁾

Exceptions to application of the Ordinance. **3.** Section twelve B of the Principal Ordinance is amended by adding at the end thereof the following sub-section:—

“ (2.) The provisions of this Ordinance relating to the sale of liquor, shall not apply to the sale of liquor, during an actual flight of an aircraft, to a passenger in the aircraft, where the sale is made by or on behalf of the owner of the aircraft and the liquor is sold for the purpose of being consumed during that flight.”.
