AMENDMENT OF THE LICENCES REGULATIONS 1934.⁽¹⁾

Statutory Rules.

No. 9 of 1949.

1. The *Licences Regulations 1934*⁽²⁾ of the Territory of New Guinea are hereby amended by adding immediately after regulation 25 thereof the following new Regulation:—

“ 26. Co-operative Societies registered under the provisions of the *Co-operative Societies Ordinance 1948*⁽³⁾ of the Territory of Papua-New Guinea are exempted from the requirements of the Ordinance.”.

(a) These Regulations stated in their introductory part that they were “ to come into operation forthwith ”. At the relevant dates in 1949 the *Licences Ordinance 1923-1937* (under which these Regulations were made) provided by Section 7 (2) that—

“ All regulations made under the Ordinance shall be published in the *New Guinea Gazette*, and shall take effect from the date of such publication, or from a later date specified therein ”.

Section 55 (1) of the *Ordinances Interpretation Ordinance 1949* provides that a reference in an Ordinance of the Territory of New Guinea to “ the *New Guinea Gazette* ” shall be read as a reference to the *Government Gazette* of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea.
