

## PROCLAMATIONS MADE PURSUANT TO SECTION 6 OF THE RESTRICTED AREAS ORDINANCE 1950 DECLARING AREAS TO BE RESTRICTED AREAS.

Particulars of these Proclamations made under Section 4 of the repealed *Uncontrolled Areas Ordinance* 1925-1938 including Proclamations continued in force by Section 3 of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance* 1950 are set out in the Table below, and certain of the Proclamations are printed immediately after the Table.

TEXT OF PROCLAMATIONS.

[Proclamation dated 26th July, 1951, and published in Papua and New Guinea Govt. Gaz. of 2nd August, 1951.]

PROCLAMATION.

*Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950.*

Whereas by Section 3 of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950*, it is provided that an area declared to be an uncontrolled area under the provisions of the *Uncontrolled Areas Ordinance 1925-1938* of the Territory of New Guinea shall be deemed to be a restricted area for the purposes of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950* and all Proclamations made under the provisions of the *Uncontrolled Areas Ordinance 1925-1938* of the Territory of New Guinea in force immediately before the commencement of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950* shall continue in force as if made under the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950*:

And whereas by Section 6 of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950* it is provided that the Administrator may declare certain areas to be restricted areas for the purposes of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950*:

And whereas by Proclamation<sup>(1)</sup> dated the twenty-sixth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and published in the Territory of Papua-New Guinea *Government Gazette* No. 15 of the 7th July, 1948, the area described in the First Schedule thereto was declared to be an uncontrolled area:

Now therefore, I, Jack Keith Murray, the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 6 of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950* and all other powers me enabling, do hereby revoke the Proclamation made under the *Uncontrolled Areas Ordinance 1925-1938* of the Territory of New Guinea and dated the twenty-sixth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-eight, and published in the Territory of Papua-New Guinea *Government Gazette* No. 15 of the 7th July, 1948:

And I do proclaim and declare that the areas the boundaries of which are described in the Schedule hereto shall be Restricted Areas for the purposes of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950*.

THE SCHEDULE.

1. Commencing at the point where the boundary between the Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea meets the border of Dutch New Guinea and bounded thence on the west by the said Dutch border north to its intersection with the middle thread of October River thence generally on the north-east by the respective middle threads of the said October River and Sepik River downstream and April River upstream generally south-easterly to the intersection of the said middle thread of April River with the parallel 4 degrees 28 minutes south latitude and bounded thence on the north by a straight line easterly to the intersection of the middle thread of South-West River with the meridian 143 degrees east longitude thence on the north-east by a straight line south-easterly to the summit of Mt. Schrader thence on the south-east by the shortest line to the summit of the watershed which divides the waters of Jimmi River from the waters of other left bank tributaries of Yuat River thence again on the south-east by the said summit generally south-westerly

to the summit of the watershed of Ive Ambum and Ive Lai Rivers thence generally on the south-west south-east and north-west by the respective summits of the watersheds of the said Ive Ambum and Ive Lai Rivers generally north-westerly south-westerly and south-easterly to the Sugar Loaf Mountains thence to the summit of Hagen Range thence on the east by the said summit of Hagen Range south to its intersection with the boundary between the Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea beforementioned thence again on the south-west by the said territorial boundary north-west to the point of commencement.

2. Commencing at Mt. Schrader in Schrader Range and bounded thence generally on the north and west by the respective summits of the said Schrader Range and Bismarck Range generally west and south to the intersection of the said summit of Bismarck Range with the parallel 5 degrees 30 minutes south latitude thence on the south-west by a straight line north-westerly to the point of commencement.

3. Commencing at the intersection of the meridian 144 degrees east longitude with the boundary between the Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea and bounded thence on the north-west by a straight line south-easterly to Mt. Michael in the Central Range thence again on the north-east by a straight line south-easterly to Mt. Tamiloa situated approximately in latitude 6 degrees 43 minutes south and longitude 145 degrees 41 minutes east thence again on the north-east by a straight line south-easterly to Mt. Piora in Kratke Range thence again on the north-east by a straight line south-easterly to the intersection of the meridian 146 degrees 50 minutes east longitude with the parallel 7 degrees 45 minutes south latitude thence again on the north-east by a straight line south-easterly to the intersection of the meridian 147 degrees 20 minutes east longitude with the boundary between the Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea beforementioned and bounded thence on the south-west by the said territorial boundary west and north-west to the point of commencement.

Given under my Hand at Port Moresby, this twenty-sixth day of July, One thousand nine hundred and fifty-one, and in the fifteenth year of His Majesty's reign.

**[Proclamation dated 26th July, 1951, and published in Papua and New Guinea Govt. Gaz. of 2nd August, 1951.]**

PROCLAMATION.

*Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950.*

DECLARATION OF RESTRICTED AREA.

Whereas by Section 6 of the *Restricted Areas Ordinance 1950*, it is provided that the Administrator may by Proclamation in the *Gazette* declare certain areas to be restricted areas for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

Now therefore, I, Jack Keith Murray, the Administrator of the Territory of Papua and New Guinea, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 6 of the said Ordinance and all other powers me enabling, do hereby declare the area specified in the Schedule hereto to be a Restricted Area for the purposes of the said Ordinance.

PART A : RESTRICTED AREAS—

SCHEDULE.

All that part of the Southern Highlands Division of the Territory of Papua commencing at the point where the middle thread of the Strickland River intersects the boundary between the Territory of Papua and the Territory of New Guinea and bounded thence generally on the north-east by the said territorial boundary generally south-easterly to its intersection with the summit of the range which contains Mt. Karimui thence on the south-east by a straight line south-westerly to the summit of Mt. Murray hence on the south by a straight line west to its intersection with the meridian 143 degrees 46 minutes east longitude thence on the west by the said meridian north to its intersection with the right bank of Erave River thence again on the south by a straight line easterly to the junction of the middle threads of Mubi River and Waga River thence generally on the west by the said middle thread of Waga River to a point due east of the junction of the middle threads of Auga River and the aforesaid Mubi River thence again on the south by a straight line west to the said junction of Auga River and Mubi River thence again generally on the south-west by the said middle thread of Mubi River generally north-westerly to the highest point of its source thence by the shortest line to the summit of the watershed which feeds the said source of Mubi River thence by the shortest line to the highest point of the source of Maruba River thence again on the south-east by the middle thread of the said Maruba River south-westerly to its junction with the middle thread of Tari River thence again on the north-east by the said middle thread of Tari River downstream south-easterly to the point where it approaches most nearly to the south-eastern extremity of Karius Range thence by the shortest line to the summit of the said Karius Range thence again on the south-west by the said summit of Karius Range and the summit of Muller Range north-westerly to the north-western extremity of the said Karius Range thence by the shortest line to the middle thread of Strickland River aforesaid thence generally on the north-west by the said middle thread of Strickland River generally north-easterly to the point of commencement.
