(2.) The minimum amount of commission under the last preceding sub-regulation shall, in any estate, be Three pounds, but may be reduced or dispensed with by the Administrator in particular cases where hardship would be occasioned to dependent beneficiaries.

Other charges.

- 3. The Curator shall, in addition to the commission prescribed by the last preceding regulation, charge—
 - (a) on the first day of April and the first day of October in every year, and on final distribution, on money standing to the credit of each estate, except money set apart and invested for a benficiary, an administration account and audit fee of Ten shillings;
 - (b) all expenses to which he is put, including exchange, telegrams, auctioneers' and agents' charges, freight, court fees, legal expenses or legal assistance or legal proceedings, advertising, and all other out-of-pocket expenses and expenses incurred in the administration of the estate; and
 - (c) for every office copy—per folio or part folio of 72 words, One shilling.
