

KAVIENG PUBLIC BATHS RESERVE BY-LAWS.⁽¹⁾

1. These By-laws may be cited as the *Kavieng Public Baths Reserve By-laws*.⁽¹⁾ Short title.

2. In these By-laws, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.

“reserve” means the land described in the Schedule to the proclamation⁽²⁾ under section 72 of the *Land Ordinance 1922-1933*⁽³⁾ dated the eleventh day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one published in the *New Guinea Gazette* of the sixteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and thirty-one;

“subscriber” means the holder of a ticket issued by the Trustees, or by a person authorised in writing by the Trustees to receive fees, authorising the entry of the holder into the reserve on the day or during the period specified in the ticket;

“Trustee” means a Trustee of the Kavieng Public Baths Reserve.

3. The charge for a ticket shall be as follows:— Charge.

(a) Adult male—

- (i) for one day, one shilling;
- (ii) for three months, seven shillings and six pence;
- (iii) for six months, fifteen shillings; and
- (iv) for one year, twenty-one shillings.

(b) Adult female—

- (i) for one day, one shilling;
- (ii) for three months, five shillings;
- (iii) for six months, seven shillings and six pence;
and
- (iv) for one year, ten shillings and sixpence.

(c) Persons between the ages of sixteen years and twenty-one years—

- (i) male—half the charge prescribed for an adult male; and
- (ii) female—half the charge prescribed for an adult female.

(d) Children under the age of sixteen years—no charge.

(1) The *Kavieng Public Baths Reserve By-laws* were made by the Trustees on 16.11.1934 and published in *N.G. Gaz.* of 15.1.1935. The Trustees were appointed in, and the By-laws were made pursuant to a Proclamation, dated 11.2.1931 and published in *N.G. Gaz.* of 16.2.1931, made under Section 72(1) of the *Land Ordinance 1922-1941* and printed on p. 2763.

LAND—

Prohibition of entry to reserve.

4. A person shall not, without the consent of a Trustee, enter the reserve, unless he is a subscriber.

Penalty: One pound.

Adequate costume to be worn.

5. Any person over the age of four years bathing, or being within the reserve shall be clad in a costume adequate to secure the observance of decency.

Penalty: One pound.

Power to order offenders to leave reserve.

6.—(1.) A Trustee, or any person authorized in writing by the Trustees to do so, or any European police officer, may order any person who behaves in an offensive or unseemly manner, or who contravenes any of the provisions of these By-laws, to leave the reserve.

(2.) Any person who refuses or neglects to obey an order given under this by-law shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Five pounds.

Use of dressing shed.

7. The dressing shed within the reserve shall not be used for any purpose other than undressing and dressing.

Penalty: One pound.

Filth and rubbish.

8. A person shall not bring or deposit any filth or rubbish within the reserve.

Penalty: Two pounds.

Damage to premises.

9. A person shall not damage, disfigure, or write upon, any fence, wall, dressing shed, or other structure within the reserve.

Penalty: Two pounds.

Prohibition of animals.

10. Any person who brings a dog, horse, or other animal within the reserve shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: Two pounds.
