## Regulations 1936, No. 30.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Tenements Recovery Short title. Regulations. (1)
- 2.—(1.) In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention Definitions. appears-
  - "Ordinance" means the Tenements Recovery Ordinance 1936.
- (2.) Except as otherwise provided, any reference in these Regulations to a form shall be read as a reference to a form in the Schedule to these Regulations.
- 3. A complaint or a summons under the Ordinance shall be in Complaint or accordance respectively with a form of complaint or a form of summons prescribed under the District Courts Ordinance 1924-1934(2) or any Ordinance amending that Ordinance, with such variations as may be necessary.

4.—(1.) A warrant under section 3, section 4, sub-section (2.) of Forms of section 5, or section 6 of the Ordinance shall be in accordance with Form 1, with such variations as may be necessary.

(2.) A warrant under sub-section (1.) of section 5 of the Ordinance shall be in accordance with Form 2.
