Being a Law to amend the *Organic Law on Provincial Governments and Local-level Governments,*

MADE by the National Parliament, to be deemed to have come into operation on 1 January 1998.

INTERPRETATION OF SCHEDULES 1 TO 6 (AMENDMENT OF SCHEDULE 1).

Schedule 1.1 of the *Organic Law on Provincial Governments and Local-level Governments* is amended by repealing the definition of "maritime provinces" and replacing it with the following:-

"maritime provinces" shall be the provinces of Manus, New Ireland, West New Britain, East New Britain, Milne Bay and Bougainville;"
