Being an Act to amend the *Summary Offences Act* (Chapter 264),

MADE by the National Parliament.

**1. CARRYING WEAPONS (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 12).**

Section 12 of the Principal Act is amended in Subsection (1) by repealing the penalty provision and replacing it with the following:-

"Penalty: A fine not exceeding K2 000.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding five years."

**2. DISGUISES (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 17).**

Section 17 of the Principal Act is amended by repealing the penalty provision and replacing it with the following:-

"Penalty: A fine not exceeding K500.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years."

**3. USE OF MISSILES, FIREARMS, ETC. (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 28).**

Section 28 of the Principal Act is amended by repealing Subsection (3) and replacing it with the following:-

"(3) A person -

- (a) who without reasonable cause, discharges a firearm with intent to, or in a manner likely to -
  - (i) injure, annoy or frighten any person; or
  - (ii) damage any property; or

- (b) who makes, possesses or sells a firearm, without being the holder of a valid licence under the *Firearms Act* (Chapter 310),

is guilty of an offence.

Penalty: A fine not exceeding K1 000.00 or imprisonment for a term not exceeding two years."
