

CRIMINAL FORMS RULES, 1922.⁽¹⁾

Statutory Rules.

No. 9 of 1922.

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Criminal Forms Rules, 1922.*⁽¹⁾

2. The forms contained in the Schedule to the Rules of the Supreme Court of the Colony of Queensland, made as of Wednesday the tenth day of October, 1900, and entitled *The Criminal Practice Rules of 1900*, are hereby adopted⁽²⁾ and may be used in the several cases and for the several purposes for which they are respectively applicable and when so used shall be sufficient.

3. The forms so adopted and prescribed by these Rules for the statement of offences in indictments may be used in all Courts and similar forms may be used in complaints before justices and in all other proceedings founded upon such complaints in which it is necessary to set forth a statement of an offence.

4. The Rules for Regulating Criminal Procedure and known as *The Criminal Forms Rules of 1897*, made on Wednesday the twenty-seventh day of January, 1897, and gazetted on the seventeenth day of April, 1897, are hereby repealed.
