[Proclamation dated 16th November, 1889, and published in British N.G. Govt. Gaz. of 23rd November, 1889.]

PROCLAMATION.

By SIR WILLIAM MACGREGOR, Doctor of Medicine, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of St. Michael and St. George, Administrator of British New Guinea.

WM. MACGREGOR.

I, the Administrator aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council and in virtue of the provisions of "*The Navigation Act of 1876*", (Queensland adopted), do hereby appoint and declare that so much of the waters of the Bay of Port Moresby as is contained within the following limits, that is to say—All that portion of the waters of the Bay of Port Moresby that lie to the Northward and landward of a line drawn from Paga Point to the Southern point of the most Southerly of the Lolorua (Elizabeth) Islets, and from such point to Palli Palli Point is and shall be a Port within the meaning of "*The Navigation Act of 1876*", aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Possession, this sixteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that that portion of the waters of Chiua Straits adjoining to Samarai Island in which ships sailing to and from Samarai usually anchor should be a port under the provisions of "*The Navigation Act of 1876*", (Queensland adopted). Now, therefore, I, the Administrator aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council and in virtue of the provisions of the said Act, do hereby appoint and declare that so much of the said waters as is contained within the following limits, that is to say, within a radius of half a mile described from the point that is between and equidistant from the islands of "Eboma" (Middle I.), and Samarai (Dinner I.), is and shall be a Port within the meaning of "*The Navigation Act of 1876*", aforesaid.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Possession, this sixteenth day of November, in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty-nine, and in the fifty-third year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS it is deemed expedient that the waters of Kwaiapan Bay, Woodlark Island (Murua), contained within a line drawn from

the centre of Simun Point, Nesai Island, to the centre of Tibataba Point, Murua, should be a port within the meaning of "*The Navigation Act of 1897*" (Queensland adopted).

Now, therefore, I, the Acting Administrator aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by "*The Navigation Act of 1876*" (Queensland adopted), do hereby proclaim and declare that that portion of the waters of Kwaiapan Bay, as above set forth and defined is, and shall be, a port within the meaning of "*The Navigation Act of 1876*" (Queensland adopted) aforesaid.
