

# PUBLIC OFFICERS FEES ORDINANCE, 1911.<sup>(1)</sup>

## No. 18 of 1911.

### An Ordinance to amend the Law relating to the Disposition of Fees received by Officers in the Public Service.

**B**E it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *Public Officers Fees Ordinance, 1911.*<sup>(1)</sup> Short title.

It shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by the Lieutenant-Governor by Proclamation published in the *Gazette.*<sup>(1)</sup>

2. “*The Public Officers Fees Act of 1884,*” 48 Vic. No. 5 Repeal.  
(Queensland adopted) is repealed.

3. All fees which shall hereafter be received by any officer in the Public Service under the authority of any Ordinance rule of court or regulation made in pursuance of any Ordinance for the performance of any duty as such officer shall be accounted for by such officer and paid into the Public Account of the Territory and every such officer shall be deemed to be an accounting officer within the meaning of the Financial Regulations<sup>(2)</sup> for the time being of the Territory made under the provisions of “*The Papua Act, 1905,*”<sup>(3)</sup> in respect thereof. Fees received by public officers to be paid into the public revenue.

4. This Ordinance does not apply to fees receivable by bailiffs of the Central Court<sup>(4)</sup> or bailiffs of courts of petty sessions for the performance of their duties as such bailiffs. Ordinance not to apply to bailiffs of the Central Court and courts of petty sessions.
