

**RULES AND REGULATIONS<sup>(1)(2)</sup> (QUEENSLAND, ADOPTED) IN THEIR APPLICATION TO THE TERRITORY OF PAPUA.**

**Rules and Regulations.<sup>(1)</sup>**

**FORMS.**

1. In addition to the forms<sup>(3)</sup> prescribed by "*The Registration Act*,"<sup>(4)</sup> 19 Vic., No. 34, the forms lettered A to J inclusive, and appended to these Regulations, shall be those used in the General Registry of Queensland, for obtaining particulars required to be registered concerning Births, Deaths, and Marriages.

**BIRTHS.**

*In cases where not more than 60 days have elapsed between birth and registration.*

2. When registration is effected within 60 days after the birth of a child, District Registrars shall use form "A," annexed to these regulations, for obtaining the particulars required to be registered respecting such birth.

(1) By virtue of *The Courts and Laws Adopting Ordinance (Amended) of 1889* (Section 2 and Schedule A) "those portions of every regulation or rule made under the provisions of," *inter alia*, 19 Vic. No. 34, that were in force in Queensland on 17.9.1888, were adopted as regulations and rules of British New Guinea. Section 3(4) of the *Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages Ordinance, 1912-1937*, continued in force all "regulations" in force under, *inter alia*, 19 Vic. No. 34 (Queensland, adopted), at the commencement of that Ordinance. Only so much of the *Rules and Regulations* printed herein as are both "regulations or rules" within the meaning of *The Courts and Laws Adopting Ordinance (Amended) of 1889*, and "regulations" within the meaning of Section 3(4) of the *Registration of Births, Deaths and Marriages Ordinance, 1912-1937*, are in force in the Territory.

(2) These *Rules and Regulations* of Queensland (made under 19 Vic., No. 34) in their application to the Territory of Papua, comprise the original *Rules and Regulations* of Queensland, as amended by the other Queensland Rules and Regulations referred to in the following Table:

*In cases where more than 60 days have elapsed.*

3. Where more than 60 days have elapsed between birth and registration, District Registrars shall use form "B," annexed to these regulations, for obtaining particulars required to be registered respecting any such birth and shall require the declaration at foot thereof to be made by the person registering such birth, in presence of a magistrate, and shall also collect a fee of 2s. 6d. in every such case, as provided by the 3rd Section<sup>(5)</sup> of the Act 31st Vic., No. 7.<sup>(4)</sup> The fee so collected to be forwarded by the District Registrar to the Registrar-General, in accordance with the instructions contained in his circular letter dated 30th December, 1867.

*Foundlings.*

4. District Registrars must obtain particulars required to be registered, respecting any newly-born infant found exposed, from the constable who may have found such infant or from the constable to whom the finding of any such infant may have been reported by any person, in the manner provided in the 28th Section<sup>(6)</sup> of the Act 19 Vic., No. 34,<sup>(4)</sup> and shall register the birth of such infant so far as the particulars required to be registered respecting it can be obtained.

*Illegitimate Children.*

5. In the case of an illegitimate child, District Registrars must apply, if necessary, to the mother of the child for particulars required to be registered respecting its birth, as she alone is responsible for registering it. When registering births of this kind (except in cases hereinafter referred to) District Registrars must leave the 5th and 6th columns of the Register blank, merely writing the word "illegitimate" across them in explanation of the reason why they are not filled up. If, however, the father of an illegitimate child chooses to sign the certificate of its birth and thereby acknowledges his paternity, the 5th column of the Register must be filled up in the usual manner, with particulars required to be registered respecting the father, and the word "illegitimate" should then be only written across the 6th column of the Register.

*Twins, Triplets, &c.*

6. District Registrars, when registering the birth of twins, triplets, &c., must make separate entries in the Register respecting each child, and must also insert in the 3rd column under the christian name (if any) of such child a record of the order in which each such birth

occurred—namely, “first born” or “second born,” if twins; and “first born,” “second born,” or “third born,” as the case may be, if triplets.

### *Baptismal Certificates.*

7. The attention of District Registrars is directed to the 25th section<sup>(7)</sup> of “*The Registration Act*,”<sup>(4)</sup> which makes provision on this subject. When the birth of any child has been registered and the 3rd column of the Register filled with the word “unnamed,” or when the name of any child under which its birth had been registered is subsequently altered at its baptism, either purposely or by accident, District Registrars may (subject to the provision of the section above quoted) record the name afterwards given to such child at its baptism, by making an entry in the eleventh column of the Register in the following form, viz.:—“Baptised by the name of \_\_\_\_\_ by the Reverend \_\_\_\_\_ at \_\_\_\_\_, on the \_\_\_\_\_ day of \_\_\_\_\_ A.D., 188—.”

This addition can only be made to the register on the written certificate of the minister who baptised the child, drawn in the form and issued in the manner prescribed in the 25th section<sup>(7)</sup> of “*The Registration Act*.”<sup>(4)</sup>

### *Certificates of death.*

8. District Registrars shall use Form “C” annexed to these Regulations for the purpose of ascertaining particulars concerning deaths, and they must in all cases see that the form is properly filled up by the person who signs it, or by some person on his or her behalf, and that it contains all particulars required to be registered so far as the same can be ascertained.

### *Medical certificates of cause of death.*

9. In cases where a legally qualified medical practitioner attended the deceased previous to death, a medical certificate of the cause of death, in Form “D” annexed to these Regulations, must be obtained and lodged with the certificate of death.

9A. When a medical certificate of the cause of death cannot be obtained owing to the non-attendance of a legally qualified medical practitioner on the deceased previous to death, the District Registrar must make all reasonable inquiries, through the police or otherwise, as to the cause of death and the reasons why the deceased was not attended by a legally qualified medical practitioner.

9B. If it appears to the District Registrar that the friends, relatives, or persons in charge of the deceased wilfully and unjustifiably neglected to obtain the assistance of a legally qualified medical practitioner to attend on the deceased previous to death, or that the cause of death is uncertain, or that there are any suspicious circumstances connected with the death, he should refuse to grant a certificate of registration, and should forthwith report the circumstances to the police authorities, in order that the case may be investigated and a magisterial inquiry held to ascertain the cause of death.

*Magistrate's "Information" after inquiry to ascertain cause of death.*

10. District Registrars shall use form "E," annexed to these regulations, to obtain the opinion or verdict of the Magistrate holding an inquiry as to the cause of a death, and all other particulars required from such Magistrate to be registered concerning same.

*Undertaker's certificate of burial.*

11. District Registrars must in all cases obtain undertakers' certificates of burial in the form<sup>(3)</sup> of schedule "H" to "*The Registration Act*," 19 Vic., No. 34,<sup>(4)</sup> signed by the undertaker or other person who buried the body, and by a clergyman—if one be present at the burial; such certificates to be countersigned in every instance by at least two witnesses.

*Notice required from Clergymen or other persons relative to the burial of a body.*

12. District Registrars are to see that the provisions of the 29th section<sup>(5)</sup> of "*The Registration Act*"<sup>(4)</sup> are strictly attended to, wherein amongst other things it is provided that any person who performs any religious service for the burial of a body shall send a notice of such burial to the Registrar of the District, unless at the time of such burial the undertaker or person in charge of the funeral can produce the District Registrar's certificate that the death was duly registered.

Any instance of neglect on the part of a Clergyman or other person to send notices as above-mentioned should be reported by the District Registrar to the Registrar-General. Form "F" to these regulations shall be used for sending required notice.

*Still-born Children.*

13. District Registrars are not to register either the birth or death of still-born children.

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*Foundlings.*

14. The person responsible for registering the deaths of newly-born infants found exposed, is the same as the person responsible for registering the birth. District Registrars are referred to the regulation under this heading relating to births. When the death of a newly-born infant found exposed is registered the birth should also be registered at the same time.

*Register books of births, marriages, and deaths.*

15. All register books of births, marriages, and deaths in Queensland shall be kept by the District Registrars in forms H, I, and J respectively annexed to these regulations, and the particulars therein mentioned shall be the particulars required to be registered respecting births, marriages, and deaths respectively under the provisions of "The Registration Act," 19 Vic., No. 34.<sup>(4)</sup>
