WHEREAS by *The Timber Ordinance (Consolidated) of 1909*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Lieutenant-Governor may, by Proclamation in the *Gazette*, declare a described area of Crown land to be a protected area, and it is further enacted that no timber shall be cut in a protected area:

Now, therefore, I, the Acting Administrator aforesaid, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim and declare that the Township of Port Moresby, the boundaries of which are set forth in the schedule hereto, shall be a protected area within the meaning of Section 6 of the aforesaid Ordinance:

And I further proclaim and declare that the Proclamation⁽¹⁾ dated the eleventh day of October, 1905, published in *Gazette* No. 18 of the fourteenth day of October, 1905, is hereby repealed.

(1) This Proclamation was made under *The Indigenous Timber Ordinance of 1892*, which is repealed by the *Timber Ordinance, 1909-1920*. As proclamations made under repealed Ordinances are not continued in force by the *Timber Ordinance, 1909-1920*, the purported repeal of this Proclamation is, *semble*, unnecessary.
