

WAR MEASURES REPEAL ORDINANCE, 1922. ⁽¹⁾

No. 17 of 1922.

An Ordinance to repeal the “War Precautions Ordinance, 1915-1916,” and the “Trading With The Enemy Ordinance, 1916,” and for other Purposes.

BE it enacted by the Lieutenant-Governor of the Territory of Papua with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the *War Measures Repeal Ordinance, 1922.*⁽¹⁾ Short title.

2. The *War Precautions Ordinance, 1915-1916*, and the *Trading With The Enemy Ordinance, 1916*, are hereby repealed. Repeal.

3.—(1.) The Lieutenant-Governor⁽²⁾ may make regulations⁽³⁾ prohibiting or regulating the use of the word “Anzac” or any word resembling the word “Anzac.” Regulations.

(2.) Such regulations may provide penalties not exceeding a fine of One hundred pounds or imprisonment with or without hard labour for any period not exceeding Six months or both such fine and imprisonment for breaches thereof.
