MAXIMUM PRICES FOR BREAD—RABAUL

I, MILTON FREDERICK ROBERTS, a Deputy Price Controller appointed under the *Prices Regulation Act 1949, as amended to date*, hereby make the following Order under that Act:—

PRICES ORDER No. 141

1. CITATION.

This Order may be cited as Prices Order No. 141.

2. COMMENCEMENT.

This Order shall come into operation on the date of publication of this Order in the *Gazette*.

3. REVOCATION.

Prices Order No. 94 is hereby revoked.

4. DEFINITIONS.

In this Order—

"bread" means a product obtained by baking a yeast leavened dough prepared with flour and water with or without other ingredients;

"ordinary bread" means bread made into loaves other than starch-reduced bread, protein-increased bread or milk bread as defined in this Order or fancy bread;

"milk bread" means bread which is made into loaves and which contains no less than four parts *per centum* by weight of non-fat milk solids calculated on the water-free substance;

"starch-reduced bread" or "protein increased bread" means bread which is made into loaves and which contains not less than two and seven-tenths part *per centum* by weight of nitrogen calculated on the water-free substance;

"unwrapped" in relation to the sale of any bread means that such bread is not wrapped as defined in this Order.

"wrapped" means in relation to the sale of any bread that such bread is fully enclosed prior to delivery to the place at which the bread is sold by retail, in waxed or grease-proof paper, cellulose film, polythene or other similar wrapping and that such bread was so enclosed when sold;

"foil-wrapped" means in relation to the sale of any bread that such bread is fully enclosed prior to delivery to the place at which the bread is sold by retail, in aluminium or other foil, and that such bread was so enclosed when sold.

Maximum Prices for Bread—Rabaul—continued

5. MEASUREMENT OF WEIGHT.

Where, in this Order, the maximum price fixed is related to the weight of bread, the weight is to be measured when the bread is cold.

6. MAXIMUM PRICE.

I fix and declare the maximum price at which bread included in a category described in the first column of the Schedule to this Order may be sold by wholesale and retail in the town of Rabaul to be the price specified in the second column of that Schedule opposite to the description of that category.

7. DISPLAY OF PRICES.

A person or organisation engaged in selling bread by retail in the Town of Rabaul, shall display in each of their places of business, in prominent positions and in large clear and legible figures, the types of bread loaves covered by this Order and the prices at which such loaves may be bought.
