**NOTICE OF COMMENCEMENT**

I, JOHN GUISE, G.C.M.G., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 3 of the *Statute Law Revision (Metric Conversion) Act 1974* and all other powers me enabling acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby—

- (a) fix 1st March, 1976 as the date on which the said Act shall come into force in so far as it relates to the Act and subordinate enactments set out in Parts 1 and 2 of the Schedule; and
- (b) give notice that in order to facilitate the change to the metric system of measurement, imperial standards of measurement may be used in respect of requirements under the Act and subordinate enactments set out in Parts 1 and 2 of the Schedule until 31st December, 1976.

## CONSTITUTION

## EXERCISE OF POWERS OF THE NATIONAL EXECUTIVE COUNCIL

THE National Executive Council, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 149(4) of the Constitution and all other powers it enabling, on 4th February, 1976, determined that the powers, functions, duties and responsibilities of the Council in advising the Head of State under each provision specified in Column 1 of the Schedule be exercised through the Minister specified in Column 2 and set out opposite the provision, by instrument in writing in the name of the Council.
