*Customs (Tariff) Act 1983***AMENDMENT OF EXEMPTIONS FROM IMPORT DUTY**

I, Kingsford Dibela, G.C.M.G., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 8 of the *Customs (Tariff) Act 1983* and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby amend the Exemption from Import Duty dated 27th April, 1983 and published in *National Gazette* No. G26 of 28th April, 1983—

(a) by repealing Clause 14 and inserting the following—

"Goods which are not produced within Papua New Guinea or that there is not reasonably available a suitable alternative or equivalent from a Papua New Guinea manufacturer and—

- (a) are imported by Governing Bodies of schools, Parents and Citizens Associations or Associations for similar purposes; and
- (b) are certified by the Secretary for Education to be necessary for the purposes of curricula determined by the Minister for Education or in the opinion of the Secretary for Education are for the purposes of educational administration to ensure the effective running of the school; and
- (c) the importer declares in the Application Form authorized by the Comptroller of Customs to be imported for use only for the purpose or purposes specified in paragraph (b) and further declares that being capital equipment will not be sold or otherwise disposed of within a period of three years from the date of import; and
- (d) the Comptroller of Customs is satisfied the goods are imported for the purpose or purposes specified in paragraph (b) and where the goods imported are capital equipment will not be sold or otherwise disposed of within a period of three years from the date of import,

on condition that the application is made in the form approved by the Comptroller of Customs."; and

(b) by repealing Clause 15 and inserting the following:—

"Clothes, being school uniforms which are not produced within Papua New Guinea or that there is not reasonably available a suitable alternative or equivalent from a Papua New Guinea manufacturer, and which are imported by Governing Bodies of schools and provided that the Comptroller of Customs is satisfied that they are intended for use by students attending the school."
