SPECIAL EXEMPTION FROM REGULATIONS

I, Frank Rowbottom, Chief Inspector of Mines appointed under Section 5 of the Mining (Safety) Act (Chapter 195A) acting in accordance with the powers conferred upon me by Section 77 of the Act, hereby exempt Bougainville Copper Limited, Panguna Mine, North Solomons Province from the provisions of Mining Regulations 274(b) and 281 in respect of that part of mine known as the "Drainage Tunnel and Associated Shafts" subject to the following conditions:—
