Customs Tariff Act (Chapter 101A)**EXEMPTIONS FROM IMPORT DUTY**

I, Kingsford Dibela, G.C.M.G., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers vested in me by Section 8 of the *Customs Tariff Act (Chapter 101A)* and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby—

- (a) Revoke the notice of exemptions from import duty dated 27th April, 1983 and published in the *National Gazette* No. G26 of 28th April 1983 as amended from time to time; and
- (b) Exempt from import duty the goods and classes of goods set out in the Schedule subject to such conditions as are specified in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

1. Goods, not for sale, exchange or trade, which at the time of importation are the property of, or are on firm and specified order by—

- (a) a Papua New Guinea Local Government Council; or
- (b) a Papua New Guinea Provincial Government; or
- (c) in the case of goods imported prior to 1st January, 1988 the following:—
 - (i) the Papua New Guinea National Government and its agencies;
 - (ii) the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia;

- (iii) the Australian Broadcasting Commission;
 - (iv) the Overseas Telecommunications Commission (Australia);
 - (v) the University of Papua New Guinea;
 - (vi) the Papua New Guinea University of Technology;
 - (vii) the Papua New Guinea Agriculture Bank;
 - (viii) the Papua New Guinea Bankers' College;
 - (ix) the Housing Commission;
 - (x) the National Broadcasting Commission.
2. Goods imported with the prior approval of the Minister responsible for Foreign Affairs—
- (a) subject to Paragraph (d), by and for the official use of—
 - (i) Diplomatic and Consular Missions; or
 - (ii) Official Trade Commissions; or
 - (iii) the United Nations and its agencies; or
 - (iv) organizations granted designated aid status under the *Aid Status (Privileges and Immunities) Act*; and
 - (b) subject to Paragraph (d), by and for the personal use of those members of the staff of the organizations listed in Paragraph (a) who have been accorded diplomatic status by the Minister responsible for Foreign Affairs provided these persons are—
 - (i) not Papua New Guinea citizens; and
 - (ii) not normally resident in Papua New Guinea; and
 - (iii) not otherwise engaged in another profession, business or occupation; and
 - (c) subject to Paragraph (d), by and for the personal use of the approved members of the technical and administrative staff of the organizations listed in Paragraph (a), provided
 - (i) these persons are—
 - (a) not Papua New Guinean citizens; and
 - (b) not normally resident in Papua New Guinea; and
 - (c) not otherwise engaged in another profession, business or occupation; and
 - (ii) the goods are imported within six months of a qualifying person taking up appointment, unless the Minister responsible for Foreign Affairs, for special reasons, allows otherwise; and
 - (d) in all cases the goods the subject of this provision—
 - (i) must not already have attracted duty, except for fuel; and
 - (ii) must not be disposed of within two years of the date of entry, without the prior written approval of the Minister responsible for Foreign Affairs and the payment of the duty that would, but for this exemption, have been payable at the time of entry, unless the Minister, for special reasons, determines otherwise.
3. Goods imported, and declared at the time of importation to be, imported—
- (a) in connection with a project sponsored by the United Nations or by an Agency of the United Nations; or
 - (b) for use in Papua New Guinea by, or on behalf of, a foreign Government or a foreign organization, for use solely as part of a Scheme of aid to Papua New Guinea from that Government or organization, where the Scheme of aid has received the prior approval of the Government of Papua New Guinea.
4. Such goods, under such conditions, as are specified in agreements (including agreements relating to military co-operation) between Papua New Guinea and—
- (a) regional organizations; or
 - (b) other foreign organizations.
5. Goods, not intended for sale, exchange or trade—
- (a) which are not reasonably available in the same or suitably equivalent form from Papua New Guinea producers (the landed duty-paid price must be more than ten percent less than the prices of any Papua New Guinea produced alternative); and
 - (b) which are imported by, on behalf of, or are the property of, a Community Organization, certified by the Secretary of the Department of the Prime Minister and National Executive Council as an organization that engages solely in undertakings of a public nature for the benefit of the community—
 - (i) relating to—
 - (a) the advancement of education; or
 - (b) the relief of poverty; or
 - (c) the provision of medical services; or
 - (d) community welfare projects of significant public worth; and

- (ii) the beneficiaries of which are not numerically negligible or distinguished by reason of ethnic origin or religious affirmation; and
 - (c) which the Comptroller is satisfied are imported for official use by the organization solely for the purposes listed in Paragraph (b)(i); and
 - (d) which will not be disposed of within three years from the date of entry without the prior written approval of the Comptroller and the payment of the duty that would, but for this exemption, have been payable at the time of importation, unless the Comptroller, for special reasons, determines otherwise.
6. Goods of a Capital nature for use in the celebration of divine worship—
- (a) which at the time of importation are the property of, or are on firm and specific order by a Christian Mission, imported for the official use of that Mission; and
 - (b) not intended for sale, exchange or trade; and
 - (c) which are not reasonably available in the same or suitably equivalent form from a Papua New Guinea manufacturer (the landed duty-paid price shall be at least 10 percent less than the price of any Papua New Guinea produced alternative); and
 - (d) which will not be disposed of within three years from the date of entry without the prior written approval of the Comptroller and the payment of the duty that would, but for this exemption, have been payable at the time of importation, unless the Comptroller, for special reasons, determines otherwise.
7. Goods for educational purposes—
- (a) to be used in education institutions or organizations concerned with the administration of education institutions such as Education Agencies officially recognised by the Secretary for Education or the Commissioner for Higher Education; and
 - (b) not for sale, exchange or trade; and
 - (c) which at the time of importation are the property of, or are on firm and specific order by—
 - (i) governing bodies of such institutions or organizations; or
 - (ii) Parents and Citizens Associations or other associations of similar purpose associated with such institutions; and
 - (d) not reasonably available in the same or suitably equivalent form from a Papua New Guinea producer (the landed, duty-paid price shall be at least ten percent less than the price of any domestic alternative); and
 - (e) certified by the Secretary for Education or the Commissioner of Higher Education to be necessary for the purposes of approved curricula or of educational administration to ensure the effective running of the school or schools; and
 - (f) which the Comptroller is satisfied will be used solely for the purposes listed in Paragraph (e); and
 - (g) not to be disposed of within three years of the date of import without the written approval of the Comptroller and the payment of the duty that would, but for this exemption, have been payable at the time of importation, unless the Comptroller, for special reasons, determines otherwise.
8. Goods for training purposes—
- (a) to be used in training institutions officially recognised by the Secretary for Education, or the Commissioner for Higher Education; and
 - (b) not for sale, exchange or trade, which at the time of importation are the property of, or are on firm and specific order by the governing bodies of such institutions; and
 - (c) not reasonably available in the same or suitably equivalent form from a Papua New Guinea producer (the landed, duty-paid price shall be at least ten percent less than the price of any domestic alternative); and
 - (d) certified by the Secretary for Education or the Commissioner for Higher Education to be necessary for the purposes of approved curricula or of administration to ensure the effective running of the training institution; and
 - (e) which the Comptroller is satisfied will be used solely for the purposes listed in Paragraph (d); and
 - (f) not to be disposed of within three years of the date of import without the written approval of the Comptroller and the payment of the duty that would, but for this exemption, have been payable at the time of importation, unless the Comptroller, for special reasons, determines otherwise.
9. Drugs, being substances used as medicine or in the composition of medicines for internal or external use, imported for such use; medical dressings, including cotton wool, gauze and lint imported for such use; and spirits and spiritous preparations imported for medical or scientific purposes.
10. Invalids chairs, artificial limbs, crutches and similar aids to the physically disabled; special apparatus and accessories used to increase the sense of hearing of the hearing impaired; surgical belts, trusses and the like; aids to the blind; corrective spectacles and corrective spectacle frames and lenses made to the prescription of, or imported for medical use by, a medical practitioner, optician or optical dispenser possessing qualifications acceptable to the Secretary for Health; artificial teeth and dentures imported by registered dentists or dental mechanics.

Exemptions from Import Duty—*continued*Schedule—*continued*

11. Scientific, surgical, medical, dental, veterinary, chemical, mathematical and ophthalmic instruments, apparatus and appliances and supplies therefor, including sensitized papers and film, imported by and for the official use of a scientific, medical, dental or veterinary institution or individual recognised by the Government.
12. Vehicles, ships and boats to be used solely for medical and health related purposes when—
- (a) the ship, boat or vehicle in the proposed circumstances of its use is approved by the Secretary for Health for use for medical purposes; and
 - (b) the ship, boat or vehicle is certified by the Secretary for Health as being for use in connection with medical and health measures approved by the Government; and
 - (c) an undertaking in writing has been given that the ship, boat or vehicle will be kept, used and dealt with, for three years after the time of importation, solely in connection with medical and health measures approved by the Government; and
 - (d) the ship, boat or vehicle will not be disposed of within three years of the date of import without the written approval of the Comptroller and the payment of the duty that would, but for this exemption, have been payable at the time of importation, unless the Comptroller, for special reasons, determines otherwise.
13. Materials and equipment, including camping equipment—
- (a) the property of a recognised university or scientific institution, imported solely for scientific research, where the research activities have been approved by the Head of State, acting on advice; or
 - (b) imported by a scientific expedition, approved by the Head of State, acting on advice, for use in the collection, preservation and treatment of specimen of flora and fauna.
14. Official medals and decorations, including miniatures, medallions and certificates, awarded or to be awarded by the Papua New Guinea Government or any foreign Government to an individual in recognition of services.
15. Cups, medals, shields and similar trophies, not being articles of general utility, when won abroad or bestowed abroad, where—
- (a) the purposes for which they are to be presented are indelibly inscribed on them; and
 - (b) they are not imported or stocked for the purposes of trade.
16. Personal effects of a resident of Papua New Guinea who has died abroad.
17. Goods sent to Papua New Guinea for repair and return to place of origin.
18. Goods reimported to Papua New Guinea after repair overseas, but not including the value of any replacement parts used in the repair or any other costs of the repair.
19. Goods that—
- (a) having been entered properly for home consumption into Papua New Guinea, were exported; and
 - (b) have been brought back by the exporter; and
 - (c) have remained the property of the exporter from the time of exportation until the time of re-importation; and
 - (d) the character of which has not been changed or altered.
20. Empty packages and containers that have been used in the export of goods from Papua New Guinea, upon identification by customs.
21. Portraits of the reigning Monarch and Head of State, not being for sale.
22. Bullion, coin and paper money, being legal tender, for circulation in Papua New Guinea.
23. Collections of antiques for display in public institutions; natural history specimens; curios, shells, models and wall diagrams for illustrations of natural history.
24. Goods, being—
- (a) unframed photographic prints and transparencies, whether mounted or not; and
 - (b) developed negatives, developed strip film and developed cinematographic films, of a non-commercial nature either taken by the importer or peculiarly associated with the importer and not intended for sale or other commercial use.
25. Goods imported by airfreight or by letter, packet or parcel post, being goods which, but for this exemption, would be liable for duty in an amount not exceeding K10 and not being goods that in the opinion of the Comptroller, are part of a consignment of goods the aggregate value of duty on which exceeds K10.
26. Ships' stores and aircraft stores consumed aboard overseas vessels or aircraft during visits to Papua New Guinea, but not including—
- (a) alcoholic beverages; and
 - (b) tobacco, cigars, cigarettes, tobacco products and snuff; and
 - (c) stores purchased in Papua New Guinea.

Customs Tariff Act (Chapter 101A)

REDUCED RATE OF IMPORT DUTY

I, Kingsford Dibela, G.C.M.G., K.St. J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 8(1)(b) of the *Customs Tariff Act* (Chapter 101A) and all other powers me enabling, hereby reduce to 7.5% the rate of import duty on goods and classes of goods specified in the Schedule subject to such conditions as are specified in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

1. Goods imported prior to 1st January, 1988—

- (a) by, or the property of any vessel of the Royal Australian Navy not being for the purpose of trade; or
- (b) which are not intended for sale, exchange or trade and which are not reasonably available in Papua New Guinea in the same or in suitably alternative form and which are imported by, or on behalf of or which are the property of—
 - (i) Disciplined Forces Canteen Organisation; or
 - (ii) Special Purpose Authorities.

2. (a) For the purposes of this item "event" means an event which, in the opinion of the Comptroller, is—

- (i) a trade, industrial, cultural or craft exhibition, fair or event of a like nature; or
- (ii) an exhibition or meeting primarily organised for a charitable purpose; or
- (iii) an exhibition or meeting primarily organised to promote a branch of learning, art, craft, sport or scientific, technical or cultural activity or to promote friendship between peoples or to promote religious knowledge or worship; or
- (iv) a meeting of representatives of any international organisation or international group of organisations; or
- (v) a representative meeting of an official or commemorative character,

but is not an event organised for private purposes in shops or business premises with a view to promote the sale of foreign goods.

(b) Subject to the Paragraphs (c) and (d), the following goods may be imported temporarily into Papua New Guinea upon payment of duty at a rate of 7.5%—

- (i) goods intended for display or exhibition at an event; and
- (ii) goods intended for use in connection with the display of goods at an event; and
- (iii) materials and equipment intended for use at an event.

(c) The goods must be—

- (i) in a number or quantity which, in the opinion of the Comptroller, is reasonable having regard to the purpose of their importation; and
- (ii) capable of identification on re-exportation; and
- (iii) re-exported within such time as the Comptroller determines at the time of importation; and
- (iv) not loaned or used for hire or reward; and
- (v) not removed from the place of the event, otherwise than for the purpose of re-exportation, without the prior written permission of the Comptroller.

(d) The Comptroller may, in his discretion, require that a bond be lodged or a security given for the due performance of the conditions set out in this provision. Such a bond or security shall not exceed a sum greater than the amount of duty which but for this provision would be chargeable and in addition ten per centum of that amount of duty.

(e) The Comptroller may, in his discretion, waive the requirement of re-exportation of goods the subject of this provision where the goods are—

- (i) in the nature of samples of goods; or
- (ii) of small unit value; or
- (iii) badly damaged; or
- (iv) perishable; or

(v) destroyed, consumed or changed in the process of manufacture, and where appropriate, those goods shall be disposed of in a manner approved by the Comptroller.

(f) Goods the subject of this provision may be disposed of in Papua New Guinea with the consent of the Comptroller on payment of the duty, if any, which, but for this provision, would have been payable at the time of importation.

(g) Anything derived or manufactured from goods imported at a reduced rate of duty under this provision shall, for the purposes of this provision, be deemed to be goods imported under this provision; and

(h) Nothing in this provision shall be deemed to apply to—

- (i) alcoholic beverages, tobacco and related products, and fuels; or

(ii) goods which are or may from time to time be prohibited imports under the *Customs Act*.

3. Goods imported for use specifically in or in connection with a survey of the natural resources of Papua New Guinea and comprising—

- (a) measuring equipment and earth and rock drilling equipment (including casing and drill pipe) and ancillary equipment and all parts thereof (including electrical equipment) which is an integral part of a measuring device or drilling rig; and
- (b) photographic material and equipment,

but goods other than consumables are to be entered under security that the goods will be re-exported within such time as the Comptroller allows.

4. Goods imported for use specifically in or in connection with oil exploration in Papua New Guinea comprising—

- (a) airdrop storepedoes;
- (b) caterpillar track trailers and parts thereof;
- (c) copper and bronze and brass manufactures;
- (d) core drilling outfits and parts thereof;
- (e) drilling tools; and
- (f) electric detonator exploders;
- (g) explosives, fuses and detonators;
- (h) light beacons and parts thereof and light buoys and parts thereof required specifically for the purposes of establishing aids to navigation and imported with the approval of the Marine Board; and
- (i) motor trucks and trailers designed for special oil field work; and
- (j) Mud chemical, comprising:—
 - (i) barytes;
 - (ii) bentonites;
 - (iii) chemical reagents as used in laboratories;
 - (iv) complex phosphates;
 - (v) low heat well cement;
 - (vi) mica flakes;
 - (vii) sodium dicarboxymethylcellulose;
 - (viii) starch products;
 - (ix) tannin products;
 - (x) well formation plugging agents;
 - (xi) packing for pumps and engines;
 - (xii) pneumatic tools and handles therefor;
 - (xiii) radar equipment and parts thereof;
 - (xiv) rails, carriages, trucks and wagons for running thereon, fish plates, fish bolts, tie plates and rods, switches, points, crossings and intersections;
 - (xv) tanks for oil and mud storage;
 - (xvi) teledeltos papers used with echo-sounding equipment;
 - (xvii) telephonic equipment;
 - (xviii) tents, tent-flies, tarpaulins and movable buildings;
 - (xix) lifting tackle;
 - (xx) wire lines and fittings thereof as used for drilling, road making, machinery and marine purposes;
 - (xxi) wireless transmitters and receivers and parts thereof, including batteries;
 - (xxii) prefabricated bituminous surfacing;
 - (xxiii) drill pipe lubricant.

5. Goods imported for use specifically and solely in or in connection with offshore oilwell drilling in Papua New Guinea, declared to be and which the Comptroller is satisfied are imported for that purpose.

6. Goods imported—

- (a) solely for use in the maintenance or repair of aircraft; and
- (b) which are not reasonably available in Papua New Guinea in the same or suitably equivalent form (the landed, full duty-paid price shall be at least ten percent less than the cost of Papua New Guinea alternative); and
- (c) which are covered by a release not issued by the Department responsible for Civil Aviation.

7. Unexposed photographic film declared to be, and which the Comptroller is satisfied is, for use—
- (a) solely in the commercial processing of film or in commercial printing; and
 - (b) by a firm or a branch (of a firm) approved by the Minister responsible for industry affairs as a commercial processor for film or as a commercial printer.
8. Fire engines, fire extinguishers and refills therefor, and equipment of a specialised nature including hose piping which is imported solely for fire fighting or fire detection.

Applicants or Tenderers should note—

1. Full name (block letters), occupation and address;
2. If a Company, the proper Registered Company name and address of the Company representative;
3. If more than one person, the tenancy desired and, if tenancy in common, the division of shares.

Applicants or tenderers should note—

4. That a lease cannot be held in a name registered under the Business Names Act only; and
5. That in the case of death in joint tenancy, the deceased partner's interest vests in the surviving partner and, in the case of tenancy in common, the deceased partner's interest vests in his estate.

B. TYPE OF LEASE:

Leases provided for are Business, Residence, Pastoral, Agricultural, Mission, Special Purposes and Town Subdivision Leases. With the exception of Town Subdivision Leases, State Leases may be granted for a maximum period of 99 years. Town Subdivision Leases have a maximum duration of 5 years.
