Constitutional Amendment (Motions of No Confidence)

Being a Law to alter the provision of the Constitution relating to motions of no confidence in the Prime Minister or in the Ministry.

MADE by the National Parliament.

MOTIONS OF NO CONFIDENCE (AMENDMENT OF SECTION 145)

Section 145(4) of the Constitution is amended by repealing the words "six months" and replacing them with the words "thirty months".
