*Customs Tariff Act 1990***EXEMPTION FROM AND REDUCTION OF IMPORT DUTIES IN RESPECT OF CERTAIN GOODS IMPORTED FROM THE REPUBLIC OF FIJI**

I, Silas Atopare, G.C.M.G., K.St.J., Governor-General, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 9(1)(b) of the *Customs Tariff Act 1990* and all other powers me enabling, acting with, and in accordance with, the advice of the National Executive Council, hereby, with effect on and from the date of publication of this instrument in the *National Gazette* reduce to the duty rate specified in the Schedule the import duty on goods specified in the Schedule,

where such goods—

- (a) are imported from the Republic of Fiji; and
- (b) originate in the country from which they are imported in accordance with the Rules of Origin set out in Annex 1 to Schedule 1 to the Trade Agreement between the Republic of Fiji and the Independent State of Papua New Guinea.
