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CONSTITUTION

DETERMINATION OF TITLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF MINISTERS

I, Sir Mekere Morauta, Prime Minister, by virtue of the powers conferred by Section 148 of the Constitution and all other powers me enabling, hereby:—

- (a) revoke all previous Determinations of Titles and Responsibilities of Ministers; and
- (b) determine that each Minister set out in Column 1 of each Schedule shall have:—
 - (i) the title specified in Column 1;
 - (ii) the responsibilities specified in Column 2; and
 - (iii) the responsibilities for administering the Acts (or parts of an Acts) specified in Column 3, and set out opposite the name of the Minister,
 to come into effect on and from the date of signature of this instrument.
