TENTH OLBIIL ERA KELULAU

Third Special Session, May 2017

RPPL No. 10-19 (Passed as House Bill No.10-51-3S, HD1, SD3)

AN ACT

To amend Section 102 of Title 13 to exempt state governments from certain requirements in Title 13; and to add restrictions on tariffs by Palau Public Utilities Corporation; to authorize and appropriate funds for the Our Ocean Conference 2020 Fund, and for other related purposes.

THE PEOPLE OF PALAU REPRESENTED IN THE OLBIIL ERA KELULAU DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

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Section 1. Legislative findings. The Olbiil Era Kelulau finds that national and state financial resources are finite and should be managed responsibly. Pursuant to this responsibility, the national government currently receives an exemption from the financial and logistical prerequisites and requirements when hiring nonresident workers. State governments do not receive the same exemption in Title 13, and therefore expend precious resources seeking clearances and paying fees when hiring nonresident state workers. These nonresident workers who are hired on contractual basis often perform specialized or professional work that directly benefits the states and their residents. The Olbiil Era Kelulau finds that state governments should be supported in their efforts to provide services for their residents and the national government should take positive steps to remove hindrances to more efficient governance. Therefore, the Olbiil Era Kelulau finds that a small amendment should be added to the Labor title of the Palau National Code to exempt state governments from certain clearance procedures when hiring nonresident workers.

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Section 2. <u>Amendment</u>. Section 102 of Title 13 of the Palau National Code is hereby amended by inserting the following definition (m) and re-lettering accordingly:

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"§ 102. Definitions.

In this title:

- (a) ...

(e) "Employer" means any individual, partnership, association, or corporation hiring employees in the Republic and any individual who has in his employ a domestic servant, but does not include any branch or agency of the national government.

(f) ...

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(m) "Skilled worker" means an employee with specialized skills, training, Page 1 of 3

	knowledge, and acquired ability in order to perform the duties of their employment, such
	as software development, paramedics, physicians, heavy equipment operator, mechanics,
	plumbers, craftsmen, and accountants.
	Section 3. Amendment. Section 1023 of Title 13 of the Palau National Code is
	hereby amended as follows:
	"§ 1023. Application of chapter to employees of national government.
	Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to exempt employees of the national
	government who are seeking employment during hours when they are not engaged in the
	performance of government employment, or employers other than the national
	government who are seeking to hire such employees or prospective employees, from
	complying fully with the provisions of this chapter. This chapter shall be construed to
	apply to such persons for all purposes, except insofar as rendered inapplicable by a
	specific provision of this chapter."
	Section 4. <u>Amendment</u> . Title 13 is amended by adding the following new Section:
	"§ 1078. Exemptions for State governments.
	In hiring skilled workers, state governments shall be exempted from the
Ì	provisions of this Title except for provisions required by Sections 1043 and 1044."
	Section 5. Amendment. Section 412 of Title 37 of the Palau National Code is
	hereby amended as follows:
	"§ 412 Rates; rate making process; restriction of tariff raises by Palau Public
	Utilities Corporation.
	(a) The rates set by PPUC for the electricity operations of the Republic that are in
	effect on the effective date of this act shall be the rates of PPUC on the effective date of
	this Acts, provided, however, that PPUC shall not increase any tariffs on utilities until
	after June 30, 2018; PPUC shall also provide a supplemental report to the President of
	the Republic, the Presiding Officers of the Olbiil Era Kelulau, and the Office of the Public
	Auditor on or before May 31, 2018. Such report shall include but not be limited to the
	following:
	(1) A progress report on the improvements of the water and waste water systems

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	(2) A progress report on the Water Supply Improvement Project funded by the
G	overnment of Japan;
	(3) A detailed proposed tariff schedule pursuant to Section 412 of Title 37 of the

	(5) a comprehensive action plan to stabilize utilities rates, to include the viability of
1	stablishing variable wastewater rates for establishments which obtain the majority of
1	neir water supply from water sources other than PPUC."
	Section 6. Amendment to RPPL 10-12. The title of RPPL No. 10-12 is hereby
1	mended to as follows:
	"To enact a budget law for Fiscal Year 2018 through the authorization of the sum
)	f \$91,216,414 and appropriate \$86,014,414 from the National Treasury for the annual
5	eneral operations, special revenue, and debt service budget of the Republic of Palau for
ł	ne fiscal year ending September 30, 2018, and for related purposes."
	Section 7. Amendment to RPPL 10-12. Amend RPPL No. 10-12 to add a new
5	ection 37 and renumber accordingly:
	"Section 37. Our Ocean Conference 2020 Fund. The amount of one hundred
t	housand dollars (\$100,000) is authorized to be appropriated and is hereby appropriated
te	o the Our Ocean Conference 2020 Fund. The source of such funds shall be from local
r	evenues."
	Section 8. Effective date. This Act shall take effect either upon its approval by

President of the Republic of Palau
