THE EASTERN ISLANDS COUNCIL (CONTROL OF PIGS) BYE-LAWS 1976

IN exercise of the powers conferred by section 50 of the Local Government Ordinance, and in pursuance of a resolution dated the 18th day of August 1975 the Council hereby makes the following bye-laws:—

- 1. These bye-laws may be cited as the Eastern Islands Council Citation. (Control of Pigs) Bye-laws 1976.
- 2. In these bye-laws -

Interpretation,

"Council" means the Eastern Islands Council;

- "owner", in relation to any pig, means the occupier of any premises in which the pig is ordinarily kept or permitted to live and remain, and includes any person in whose care it may temporarily be;
- "sanitary officer" means a sanitary officer appointed under the Public Health Ordinance.
- 3. (1) Any owner who wilfully or negligently allows a pig to roam Offences, uncontrolled within any village or within twenty yards of any house shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of ten dollars or in default of payment to imprisonment for three weeks.
- (2) Any owner who keeps a pig within or under any dwelling house or within twenty yards of any dwelling house shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of ten dollars or in default of payment to imprisonment for three weeks and for a continuing offence, he shall be liable to a further fine of two dollars for each day on which the offence is continued after written notice of the offence has been served on him.
- (3) If a pig damages garden crops or other property the owner of the pig shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of twenty dollars or in default of payment to imprisonment for six weeks.
- (4) Any person who obstructs or impedes any police officer or sanitary officer or area constable or officer of the Council acting in due

exercise of his powers under these bye-laws shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of ten dollars or in default of payment to imprisonment for three weeks.

Duties and powers of officers.

4. It shall be lawful for any police officer, sanitary officer, area constable or officer of the Council at all reasonable times to make enquiries to ascertain whether any breach of these bye-laws is being or has been committed.
