(NO. 7 OF 2008)**

SCHEDULE OF FEES AND CHARGES

IN exercise of the powers conferred by section 48(1) (a), and section 49 of the Civil Aviation Act 2008, I HON. VARIAN LONAMEI, Minister of Aviation and Communication do hereby make the schedule of Fees and Charges. Commencement date for this Schedule of Fees and Charges is 1st day of January 2010 or later as specified in the Schedule.

**SCHEDULE TO THE CIVIL AVIATION ACT 2008
(PART V)**

FEES AND CHARGES

1. A landing fee shall be payable in respect of the first landing of an aircraft at a specified airport on each journey from a place outside Solomon Islands at the following rate:
 - a. at a weight of up to 5,700kg; S100.00 per scheduled flight and S100.00 per non-scheduled flight;
 - b. from 5,701 kg to 15,000 kg: S20.00 per 1000 kg or part thereof;
 - c. from 15,001 kg to 40,000 kg: S30.00 per 1000 kg or part thereof;
 - d. from 40,0001 kg to 50,000 kg: S40.00 per 1000 kg or part thereof;
 - e. above 50,0001 kg: S60.00 per 1000 kg or part thereof.

2. The payment of a landing fee shall entitle the pilot-in-command of an aircraft to:
 - a. the use of the airport for landing and departure;
 - b. the use of any radio facilities at or associated with and airport;
 - c. the use of any visual approach or landing aid;
 - d. the supply of available information on route and weather conditions; and
 - e. the assistance of airport personnel, if any are available in guiding and parking the aircraft.

3. The payment of a landing fee will not include any aircraft parking fees or operational charges that maybe levied from time to time for radio services or message transmitted through the fixed aeronautical telecommunications system.

4. Landing charges will be levied at the following places:
 - a. Honiara International Airport Henderson Field;
 - b. Gizo/Nusatupe;
 - c. Munda
 - d. Ballalae; and
 - f. Such airports as the Minister may designate by writing in the *Gazette* from time to time.

5. The following aircraft shall be exempt from landing fees;
 - a. aircraft being used for a Government ceremonial purpose;
 - b. State aircraft, Official aircraft and such other aircraft as may be specified in writing by the Minister;
 - c. aircraft being used to calibrate navigational aids in Solomon Islands;
 - d. aircraft engaged in search and rescue flights;
 - e. aircraft for which a written application for such exemption has been made to and granted by the Minister.

6. The fees to be paid for lighting shall include approach, runway, taxiway, obstacle and apron lighting at the following rates:
 - a. up to 5,700 kg S6.00 per 500 kg or part thereof;
 - b. for aircraft above 5,700 kg the rate shall be:
 - i. S250.00 for each take-off and S250.00 for each landing;
 - ii. S500.00 per hour when continuous display is required.

7. The following aircraft shall be exempt from lighting fees:
- a. State aircraft;
 - b. Official aircraft;
 - c. aircraft operated by a flying school or club approved by the Minister in writing for such purposes;
 - d. such aircraft as the Minister may approve in writing from time to time.
8. Each passenger departing Solomon Islands by air shall pay an airport service charge of \$100.00 prior to departure. Exemptions from the airport service charge shall include:
- a. crews of aircraft travelling on duty;
 - b. children under two years of age;
 - c. Heads of State including the Governor-General;
 - d. Prime Minister;
 - e. Cabinet Ministers;
 - f. Leader of Opposition;
 - g. Members of Parliament;
 - h. Members of the Diplomatic and Consular Corps;
 - i. passengers travelling on a visiting state or military aircraft;
 - j. passengers who have already paid an airport service charge, but whose aircraft returns to Solomon Islands for technical or other reasons and who subsequently re-embark to recommence their flight;
 - k. transferring passengers with a change of aircraft or flight number with less than twenty-four hours between the scheduled times of arrival and departure;
 - l. transit passengers, including any who have to leave the Customs area for a technical reason;
 - m. such passengers as the Minister may in writing at any time exempt from the airport service charge.
9. Each passenger departing Solomon Islands by air shall pay a Safety and Security Oversight charge of \$15.00 prior to departure. This charge funds Solomon Islands' commitment to safety and security oversight services received from the Pacific Aviation Safety Office (PASO). Exemptions from the passenger Safety and Security Charge shall include:

- a. crews of aircraft travelling on duty;
- b. children under two years of age;
- c. Heads of State including the Governor-General;
- d. Prime Minister;
- e. Cabinet Ministers;
- f. Leader of Opposition;
- g. Members of Parliament;
- h. Members of the Diplomatic and Consular Corps;
- i. passengers travelling on a visiting state or military aircraft;
- j. passengers who have already paid a Safety and Security Oversight charge, but whose aircraft returns to Solomon Islands for technical or other reasons and who subsequently re-embark to recommence their flight;
- k. transferring passengers with a change of aircraft or flight number with less than twenty-four hours between the scheduled times of arrival and departure;
- l. transit passengers, including any who have to leave the Customs area for a technical reason;
- m. such passengers as the Minister may in writing at any time exempt from the passenger Safety and Security Oversight charge.

10. Aviation Security Service issued identification/access cards and vehicle passes will be issued to appropriately cleared persons at the following rate:

- a. Permanent identification/access card, renewed annually;
 - i. initial issue: S150.00
 - ii. annual renewal: S150.00
 - iii. renewal if lost/stolen/broken: S150.00
- b. Temporary identification access card:
 - i. issue: S50.00
- c. Vehicle pass, renewed annually:
 - i. initial issue: S150.00
 - ii. annual renewal: S150.00
 - iii. renewal if lost/stolen/broken: S150.00

11. A fee of S300.00 shall be payable for the initial issue of the Solomon Islands Aeronautical Information Publication and an annual fee of S200.00 shall be payable for the amendment service thereto. The payment for the initial issue shall include the amendment service for that calendar year.

12. A fee of S200.00 shall be payable each calendar year for the issue of any Notices to Airmen, Class 2 and Aeronautical Information Circulars.

13. The intentional aviation authorities and organisations with which Solomon Islands exchanges aeronautical information and other Government Departments are exempt from the payment of aeronautical services fees.

14. Parking fees for vehicles in prescribed parking areas will be levied by the Director of Civil Aviation at any airport at a rate of S10.00 per day or part thereof.

15. Parking fees for visiting aircraft at any airport may be levied by the Director at any airport at a rate of S100.00 per day or part thereof.

16. The following aircraft shall be exempt from parking fees:

- e. State aircraft;
- f. Official aircraft;
- g. aircraft operated by a flying school or club approved by the Minister in writing for such purpose;
- h. aircraft of airlines operating approved domestic services within Solomon Islands;
- i. such aircraft as the Minister may approve in writing from time to time.

17. Taxis and other public transport vehicles may be licensed by the Director of Civil Aviation to operate pickup services from Honiara International Airport Henderson Field International Terminal at a rate of S250.00 per year or part thereof. All other taxis or public transport vehicles may drop off passengers but may not uplift them from the International Terminal.

Where for any purpose under the Civil Aviation Act 2008 or any Rules made under the Act, any employee of the Authority or person so delegated under Sections 25, 26, 27 or 28 of the Act carries out:

- a. The assessment of an application in respect of the grant or renewal of, or any amendment to, any approval; or
- b. Any monitoring,

a charge of \$1500.00 per person hour (pph) is payable in respect of that work if a fee or charge is not prescribed or fixed in respect of that work by or under any other provision of these regulations.

24. Within the Honiara Flight Information Region Air Navigation charges for upper and lower airspace shall be charged at the following rates calculated by the formulas specified in the following paragraphs:

- a. Upper airspace: for flights in Class A airspace above Flight Level 245 and below Flight Level 600 (24,500 feet to 60,000 feet). $AUDS3.00 \times 0.01D \times \text{square root of the MTOW}$
- b. Lower airspace: for flights travelling between two locations in Class G airspace from the surface to Flight Level 245 (0 feet to 24,500 feet) by the formula $SBDS20.00 \times H$.

In the above formulas:

- i. 'D' is the great circle distance represented in kilometres,
 - ii. 'MTOW' is the aircraft maximum take-off weight represented in metric tons,
and
 - iii. 'H' is the flight time in hours
- c. State aircraft, aircraft engaged in flying training or ~~post-maintenance flight testing, and such other aircraft as may~~ be specified in writing by the Minister are exempted from the requirements of 22 a & b.
 - d. Air services Australia is authorised by contract to collect Air Navigation fees in respect of Class A airspace on behalf of Solomon Islands.

**NORTH NEW GEORGIA TIMBER CORPORATION
(AMENDMENT) ACT 2010**

- Short title and commencement: 1. This Act may be cited as the North New Georgia Timber Corporation (Amendment) Act 2010, and is deemed to have come into force on 3rd September 2009.
- Section 3 amended: 2. Section 3 of the principal Act is amended by adding after subsection (4) the following subsections –
- “(5) There shall be a General Manager of the Corporation who shall be appointed by the Board on such terms and conditions as the Board may determine.
- “(6) The General Manager shall be responsible for the management of the Corporation and other functions and duties as the Board may determine.”.
- Section 4 amended: 3. Section 4 of the principal Act is amended in subsection (3) by deleting “thirty years” and substituting “forty-five years”.
- New section 8A added: 4. The principal Act is amended by adding after section 8 the following section –
- “8A. (1) The Corporation shall keep proper accounts and proper records in relation to its accounts and shall prepare in each financial year of the Corporation a statement of accounts in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles and practices.
- (2) The accounts and statements of accounts shall be audited by an auditor, appointed by the Board, who shall prepare and submit to the Board a report on the audit undertaken under this subsection.
- (3) The Corporation shall, as soon as possible after the end of each financial year of the Corporation, prepare an annual report on its operations during that year.
- (4) The Corporation shall lay the annual report of the Corporation, including the auditor’s report prepared under subsection (2), at a meeting held under section 8.”.

1. This Order may be cited as the Price Control (Application to Goods and Restriction of Prices) (Amendment) (No.5) Order 2010 and shall come into operation on 1st June 2010.

2. The Price Control Order (Application to Goods and Restriction of Prices) Order 1987 (L/N 47/87) is amended in schedule 3 by revoking Serial NO.13 (Petroleum Products) and substituting the following –
