CREW'S STORES LIST

NOTICE

- To Masters and Officers and Crew Members of Vessels arriving from overseas regarding Goods brought in as their Personal Effects.
- 1. This form must be completed and handed to the Customs Boarding Officer. It must be signed by each member of the crew (including the Master and Officers) who must state opposite his signature the quantity of dutiable articles in his possession. If he has nothing he must state 'NIL'
- 2. All articles acquried overseas or during the voyage must be declared.
- 3. With few exceptions, and usually only under certain circumstances, ALL ARTICLES ARE DUTIABLE when imported into Solomon Islands or the waters thereof. All articles which have not been taken into consumption or used should, therefore, be declared, to avoid penalties.
- 4. Any dutiable, prohibited, or restricted articles which are the property of any member of the crew, found in the vessel and not declared will be liable to forfeiture and the owner thereof will be liable to prosecution.
- 5. Members of a crew who remain on a vessel during her stay in port, may after declaration, be allowed under certain conditions, to retain in their possession for their own use on board reasonable quantities of tobacco, alcohol and other dutiable goods. Such goods MUST NOT BE LANDED, nor any other article whatever be brought ashore without the written authority of the Proper Officer of Customs provided that ongoing ashore for short periods members of crews may have in their possession bona fide for their own immediate use no more than 2pkts of Cigarettes or 5 Cigars or 100 grams of Tobacco, but NO ALCOHOL.

- 6. Members of a crew of whatever rank, when finally leaving the vessel with their personal effects, are allowed to take ashore, free of duty, FOR THEIR OWN PERSONAL CONSUMPTION, the following quantities of the undermentioned goods, when they form the whole of their unconsumed stores:
- 2.5 litres of Alcohol, 250 Cigarettes or 50 Cigars or 250 grams of Tobacco. Any quantity in excess of the above amounts renders the whole quantity of tobacco or spirits, as the case may be, liable to duty.
- 7. Surplus Ships Stores, cats, dogs and other feline and canine animals and livestock must be produced to the Customs Boarding Officer when first boarding the vessel and must be included in the Report of Ship's Stores (Form C.1) and borne on the Ship's Report (From C4 (Ship) and C.5 (Aircraft).
- 8. Crew members must declare if you are carrying or have in your possession or in your baggage, cash of more than SBD50,000.00 (or Foreign Currency equivalent).

SOLOMON ISLANDS CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

NOTICE TO CAPTAINS AND CREW MEMBERS OF AIRCRAFT

(Please read this Notice before completing the reverse side)

Certain articles subject to Customs control which may be in your possession must be declared on Form C46. Those articles include:-

- TOBACCO, CIGARRETES, CIGARS, SPIRITUOUS LIQUORS, WINES, CASH OF MORE THAN SBD50,000.00 OR FOREGIN CURRENCY EQUIVALENT, RADIOS, VCD/CD PLAYERS, VCDD/CD MOVIES, TAPE RECORDERS, TV SETS, SPORTING REQUISITES, JEWELLERY, WATCHES AND THE LIKE.
- PROHIBITED/RESTRICTED IMPORTS SUCH AS FIREARMS AND AMMUNITION, MEDICINES, DANGEROUS WEAPONS (including springbladed knives, daggers, bludgeons, cashes, knuckle-dusters and swordsticks), INDECENT OR OBSCENCE ARTICLES, PRINTS.
- ILLICIT DRUGS for example NARCOTICS, HALLUCINOGENS, AMPHETAMINES, BARBITURATES AND TRANQUILLISERS.

NOTE: Articles or goods subject to Customs control MUST NOT BE LANDED WITHOUT AUTHORITY NOTES FOR COMPLETION OF FORM C46.

- A form C46 is required to be completed and signed by each crew member.
- THE CAPTAIN IS REQUIRED TO ENSURE THAT ALL CREW MEMBERS HAVE BEEN MADE FULLY AWARE OF REQUIREMENTS-WARNING: PENALTIES FOR DRUG OFFENCES AND FOR MAKING A FALSE DECLARATION IN SOLOMON ISLANDS ARE SEVERE.

- Report all articles and goods subject to Customs control in your possession or custody including those held or intended for someone else.
- Wearing apparel and other bona fide personal effects of a general or trivial nature in use need not be declared.
- State the QUANTITY, DESCRIPTION AND VALUE of goods held and SERIAL NUMBERS of radios, tape recorders, record players, VCD/CD players, VCD/CD movies watches, cameras, binoculars, etc. You may be asked for a purchase receipt.
- If you have nothing to declare write NIL in the appropriate section on Form C46.

The completed Form C46 is to be handed to Customs on arrival of the aircraft at the first airport of call in Solomon Islands.

- Customs will retain all Forms relating to crew of Solomon Islands operated aircraft. Subsequent to clearence at the airport of disembarkation Customs will return those Forms belonging to crew of foreign-operated aircraft for re-presenting upon departure. For crew not disembarking, the Form will be on-forwarded with the Customs documents on the aircraft for retention by Customs at the final airport.
- NOTE: Aircraft crew domicile in Solomon Islands may be granted an allowance of 250 Cigarettes or 250 grams of Tobacco or 50 Cigars and 2.5 litres of alcoholic liquor duty free on arrival in Solomon Islands. These concessions are granted to individual crew members once only in 31 days irrespect of the number of inwards overseas flights completed.
