The year one thousand nine hundred and twelve, and the twentieth day of February, the Joint Court composed of the Count of Buena Esperanza, President; G.G.Alexander, British Judge; J.Colonna, French Judge; 'n the presence of the Count of Andino, Public Prosecutor; M.Coursin, Acting Registrar, holding the pen, Sitting in police cases, pronounced the following judgment:-

THE JOINT COURT?

SEEING THAT the accused Leon Chauviere has not appeared;
AND WHEREAS it has not been proved that Chauviere has been duly served with the summons to appear, firstly as the summons has not been served either by the Bailiff of the Court or by a police officer, and secondly, if it is admitted that anyone can be surmoned by registered letter thereby satisfying the provisions of Article 16 of the Criminal Procedure, the text of which Article is as follows:-

Article 16. "....or some other person delegated by the Public Prosecutor" the summons forwarded by means of an unregistered letter should be cancelled;

Therefore cancels the surrons in question above; adjourns the case "sine die"; orders the surmons to be served on the accused either by the Bailiff of the Court, or by a

police officer, or by a letter registered at the Condominium Post Office.
