J - Court of the New Hebrides

Criminal Session of December 13th, 1912

The Public Prosecutor versus Eugene Carion, Craig's Cove, Ambrym, accused of a breach of Article 59 of the Convention of October 20th, 1911.

This thirteenth day of December one thousand nine hundred and twelve, at 3 o'clock P.M., The Joint Court, consisting of The President, Count Buena Esperanza, the French Judge, Jean Colombe; the British Judge, T. E. Rosby; in the presence of the Public Prosecutor, Count Andino; M. Blugel the Registrar recording; sitting as a Court of summary jurisdiction, of first and last instance, in public session, delivered the following judgment:

The Joint Court:

Having heard read the documents of the case; the accused in his plea; the Public Prosecutor in his charge;

Having heard the accused in his defence both by him made and by his Counsel, M. Cousin;

Whereas from the facts adduced and from the evidence of the sworn witnesses there does not appear sufficient proof that Carion did sell to the native Malou Saka-hi, mentioned in the summons, a bottle of rum during the month of May 1912 at Craig's Cove, Ambrym, New Hebrides;

For these reasons:

Discharges Carion, without costs; orders the costs to be paid by the Condemned.

Done, judged and delivered the day, month and year as at head. By the Joint Court, the President, the French and British Judges who signed with the Registrar.
