establish a Chamber of Commerce, Industry and Agriculture in the New Hebrides.

Regulation No. 14 of 1962 was published in Condominium rette No. 216 and is reprinted as amended by Joint Regulation No. 22 1966 (Condominium Gazette No. 242) and Joint Regulation No. 16 1972 (Condominium Gazette No. 315).

namber" shall mean the Chamber of Commerce, Industry and Agriculture established by this Joint Regulation;

tish" and "French" shall include both ressortissants and subjects or citizens of the two Powers as the case may be.

PART I

ORGANISATION OF THE CHAMBER

There is hereby constituted for the New Hebrides a public to be called "The Chamber of Commerce, Industry and illure of the New Hebrides". The Chamber shall be a corporate

The Chamber shall consist of twenty members of whom hall be elected in accordance with the provisions of sections 3 of this Regulation and twelve shall be nominated by the at Commissioners jointly.

The Chamber shall be divided into two sections each

The first section, representing agricultural interests, shall

six members representing British and French agricultural interests. Of these six, four shall be elected by an electoral college composed of: British or French owners of agricultural properties who manage their own properties; the Managers or Lessees of British or French plantations; and the Chairman or Managing Director of British or French companies of which the primary interest is agriculture:

one shall be nominated by the British Resident Commis-

one shall be nominated by the French Resident Commissioner;

- (ii) four members representing the agricultural interests of natives of the New Hebrides who shall be nominated by the Resident Commissioners jointly from a list submitted by the District Agents after consulting representatives of these interests in their districts.
- (B) The second section, representing commercial and industrial ests, shall consist of—
- (i) six members representing British and French commercial and industrial interests. Of these, four shall be elected by an electoral college composed of: Managers or Managing Directors of British or French commercial or industrial undertakings and managers of branches thereof; agents of insurance companies; owners of vessels of not less than 75 Register (Net) tons; ship builders; agents of shipping companies or airlines; managers of Banks;

one shall be nominated by the British Resident Commissioner;

- one shall be nominated by the French Resident Commissioner;
- (ii) four members representing the commercial and industrial interests of natives of the New Hebrides who shall be nominated by the Resident Commissioners jointly from a list submitted by the District Agents after consulting representatives of these interests in their districts.

The members of the electoral colleges shall be at least one years of age and shall be actively engaged in and have sed in the New Hebrides for at least one year an agricultural, dercial or industrial pursuit recognised by the Electoral Comas being of sufficient economic importance to qualify them for ion in one of the nominal rolls of the electoral college. Any qualified for inscription in both nominal rolls shall be ed on the roll for the section of the Chamber representing his all interest. No person who is an undischarged bankrupt or been convicted of an offence involving dishonesty or moral file for which he has been sentenced to a period of imprisonal six months or more shall be eligible for membership of an all college.

Nominal rolls of the electoral colleges provided for in 3 shall be drawn up by districts each year between the 1st st of January by an Electoral Committee consisting of the nt Commissioners or their representatives, and four persons ted by the Resident Commissioners jointly. The Resident assioners, or their representatives, shall preside alternately at tings of the Committee. The nominal rolls shall include the of all persons who on the 1st of January of that year qualify mbership of the electoral colleges under sections 3 and 4.

6. Copies of the nominal rolls shall be open to inspection by public at the offices of the National Administrations and at all trict Agencies for a period of not less than one month and the blic shall be notified of the dates between which the rolls shall be in to inspection. Any person may during the period during which rolls are open to inspection examine the rolls and lodge in writing the Electoral Committee objections to the inclusion or omission may person. The Committee shall inquire into any objections and decision thereon shall be final. On the expiry of the period for extion and after any amendment decided by the Committee the shall be published in the Official Gazette and publicly displayed the offices of the National Administrations and at District racies.

Notice of the date of an election shall thereafter be given numbers of the electoral college by Joint Decision of the Resident minissioners at least two months before the date fixed for the on.

- (a) (1) Each elector shall cast his vote for a list containing candidates to represent that section of the Chamber for which qualified as an elector under section 3. Each list of four candishall contain at least one British and one French candidate. andidate may be proposed for election on more than one list.
 - The lists of candidates shall be delivered to the Electoral mittee at least one month before the date fixed for the election shall be published at each District Agency at least fifteen days the date fixed for the election.
 - The Resident Commissioners shall make Joint Rules to the for electoral procedure.

There shall be a polling station in each Administrative supervised by one of the District Agents who shall be by lot 15 days in advance of the date of the election and by two literate members of the electoral college who are not tes for election. Postal votes shall be permitted in accordance Joint Rules provided for in sub-section (3) of section 8 of this ion. The elections shall take place on a Saturday and the stations shall remain open for six consecutive hours.

At the close of the poll the presiding District Agent shall be votes and declare the number of votes cast for each list. prepare a report in triplicate, which shall be countersigned wo other persons supervising the polling station, and shall two copies of the report to the Resident Commissioners, the third copy for his records.

- 12. (1) No election shall be valid on the first poll unless one the lists of candidates shall have received a majority of the votes which shall not be less than one quarter of the number of electors wribed on the nominal roll.
- (2) If no list of candidates receives the necessary majority on first poll, a second poll shall be held fifteen days later, the result which shall be decided by simple majority whatever the number of as cast.
- [12A. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this dilation, if only one list of candidates for each section of the amber shall be delivered to the Electoral Committee pursuant to section (2) of section 8, the Resident Commissioners shall by the Decision cancel the elections notified in accordance with ion 7 and appoint the candidates named in each list as members the Chamber elected unopposed.]
- 13. Any elector who has attained 25 years of age shall be lible for election to the Chamber.
- 14. The members elected shall hold office for three years. Indees shall be eligible for re-election.
- 15. When the number of elected members of the Chamber is sed from any cause whatsoever to four, new elections to fill the neces shall be held within two months of the last vacancy arising. One elected at such supplementary elections shall retain their only for the unexpired term of the member whom they replace.
- At its first meeting and subsequently after each triennial on the Chamber shall elect from among its members a President, Acc. Presidents, a Secretary and a Treasurer. The said officers gold office for a term of three years and shall be eligible for ation. [The said officers may, if they consider it necessary, co-opt among the members of the Chamber two persons to assist the ary and Treasurer in their work.]

- No meeting of the Chamber shall be held unless at least the number of members eligible to attend are present. All ons shall be decided by a majority of the votes of those present. There is an equality of votes the President or member presiding have a casting vote. In the absence of the President the elder Vice-Presidents shall preside.
- The Resident Commissioners, or their representatives, may time attend meetings of the Chamber and shall have a convey voice in its deliberations.

- 19. The Chamber shall draw up standing rules which shall equire the approval of the Resident Commissioners.
- 20. The Chamber shall keep minutes of its meetings, copies of thich shall be sent without delay to the Resident Commissioners.

PART II

POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE CHAMBER

- 21. The functions of the Chamber shall be-
 - (i) to advise the Resident Commissioners and provide them with information on agricultural, commercial and industrial matters affecting the territory;
- (ii) to recommend measures for increasing the agricultural, commercial and industrial potential of the territory;
- (iii) to undertake any work or manage any service of economic interest to the territory subject to the limitations set out in Section 23.
- 22. In addition to giving any advice which the Resident commissioners may at any time seek, the Chamber may on its own fliative voice an opinion on any matter of economic interest.
 - 23. The Chamber may be authorised by the Resident Com-
 - (i) acquire or construct buildings for its own use, and manage such buildings;
 - (ii) undertake any work connected with agricultural, commercial and industrial development;
 - (iii) establish, acquire or manage for the public benefit any undertaking of commercial utility, such as: a warehouse, including a bonded warehouse; a public saleroom, a commercial or technical school; land or water transport; pilotage; a wharf; the grading of produce;
 - (iv) operate any public utility or acquire, take over or manage any undertaking established by the Resident Commissioners.
 - The Chamber may correspond with other Chambers of innerce or similar organisations and may, through its President, into agreements with such bodies on matters of economic test.
 - 25. The Chamber shall not engage in political or religious roversy and any resolution on matters which are not within its petence shall be null and void.

PART III

FINANCIAL PROVISIONS

- 26. The expenditure of the Chamber shall be met from-
- (i) any profits arising from the administration or management of any economic undertaking authorised under section 23;
- (ii) any gift or bequest by individuals accepted by the Chamber with the approval of the Resident Commissioners;
- (iii) any grants which may be authorised by the Resident Commissioners from funds provided in the Condominium Estimates.
- 7. (1) The Chamber shall prepare annual estimates of the and expenditure which shall require the approval of the dent Commissioners;
- (2) These estimates shall contain a separate section for each raking managed by the Chamber, and no transfer of funds from section to another shall take place without the approval of the dent Commissioners;
- Any surplus of revenue over expenditure shall be paid into five fund to meet urgent and unforeseen expenditure; Provided uch reserve fund shall not exceed the total annual receipts of namber. Any sums in excess of this limit shall be invested in the tory subject to the approval of the Resident Commissioners. No naval from the fund may be made without the approval of the ent Commissioners; a statement showing the position of the nall be included in the annual estimates and the annual ents;

The Chamber may be authorised by the Resident Comners to raise loans for any purpose approved under Section 23 ovision shall be made in the Chamber's estimates for servicing

PART IV

TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

Notwithstanding the provisions of Section 5 the first rolls shall be drawn up in the month following the signature soint Regulation.

The Resident Commissioners may make any Joint Rules for the implementation of this Regulation.

31. This Regulation may be cited as the Joint Chamber of Commerce Regulation No. 14 of 1962 and shall have effect from the date of signature.
