# THE COASTAL TRADING (CONTROL) (AMENDMENT) ACT No. 24 OF 1981

To amend section 4 of the Coastal Trading (Control) Regulation No. 17 of 1980.

Be it enacted by the President and Parliament as follows :-

# endment of R. 17/80.

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- 1. The Coastal Trading (Control) Regulation No. 17 of 1980 is amended by adding the following subsection to section 4:--
  - \*(3) The Licencing Officer shall obtain the consent of the Minister before granting a coastal trading licence to :-
    - (a) any person who is not a citizen of Vanuatu;
    - (b) a partnership, where any partner is not a citizen of Vanuatu;
    - (c) any body corporate the members of which include a person who is not a citizen of Vanuatu;
    - (d) any body corporate or partnership which in the opinion of the Licencing Officer is controlled by 1-
      - (i) a person, not being a citizen of Vanuatu;
      - (ii) a body corporate, the members of which include a person who is not a citizen of Vanuatu."
- Amencement. 2. This Act shall come into force on the date of its publication in the Gazette.

# THE COCOA ACT No. 26 OF 1981

#### Explanatory Note

The purpose of this Bill is to improve the quality of Vanuatu cocos beans.

In recent years the quality of Vanuatu cocca beans has declined considerably and they just about must the minimum standards laid down by the Food and Agricultural Organisation. Consequently only low prices are paid for Vanuatu cocca beans.

The purpose of this law is to enforce high standards for the commercial processing, handling and storage of codes beans and for setting an export standard for Vanuato codes beans.

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# BILL FOR THE COCOA ACT No. OF 1981

To provide for the control of cocca boan quality.

Be it enacted by the President and Parliament as follows :-

#### PART 1 : PRELIMINARY

## Exclusion of Seed Cacao.

- (1) This Act shall not apply to or in relation to cacao beans used or intended to be used as seed material.
  - (2) The burden of proof that any caceo beans are or have been used or are intended for use at any particular time as send material lies on the person alleging it.

#### Interpretation.

2. In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,

"Cacao bean" means the cond of the cacao trees (Theobrome cacao L) which has not been passed through a dermantation and drying process;

"Cocoa bean" means a whole cacee been which has been formented and dried;

"Cocoa dealer" meens any person who buys and sells cocos beans;

"Cocoa exporter" means the Vanuatu Commodities Marketing Board established under the Vanuatu Commodities marketing Board Act No. 10 of 1981 or any person authorized by or under it;

"Cocoa processing" weens the process of fermenting and drying caceo beens, and includes any other process incidental thereto for the purpose of converting caceo beens into cocoa beens;

"Cocos producer" means a cacao grower;

"Director" means the Director of Agriculture or such other person we the Minister may appoint as Director for the purposes of this Act;

"Fermentary" means any place or premises maintained for coops processing;

"Person" includes a body corporate;

"Vanuatu Export Cocoa" means cocoa beans intended for export which comply with the standards prescribed by the Minister under section 10.

#### PART 2 : LICENCING OF COCOA FERMENTARIES AND DEALERS

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nd dealers.

- (1) No person shall -
  - (a) establish or maintain a fermentary; or
  - (b) carry on business as a cocoa dealer,

without being in possession of a valid licence issued by the Director.

- (2) A person who establishes or maintains a fermantary solely for the processing of cacso beans which,
  - (a) are grown by such person, and
  - (b) are sold through a licenced cocea desler or exporter,

shall not require a licance.

## plications r licances.

- 4. (1) Applications for the licencing of fermentaries or for carrying on business as cocca dealers shall be made in the prescribed form to the Director.
  - (2) The Director may reject an application for a licence made under subsection (1) if he is satisfied that the applicant,
    - (a) has insufficient funds to operate a fermentery or carry on the business of a cocoα dealer; or
    - (b) has no adequate facilities or plans for adequate facilities, for the processing, quality control, handling, storage, transport and marketing of cacao beans or cocoa beans, as the case may be.

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5. On payment of the prescribed fee, the Director may issue a licence in the prescribed form for a fermentary or cocoa dealer as the case may be.

#### dorsement licences.

6. (1) The Director may endorse any licence issued under section 5 with such conditions and restrictions as he considers appropriate either at the time of issuing the licence or at any time thereafter, and datails of all such endorsements shall be entered in a register of licences.

(2) The Director may suspend the licence for such period as he considers fit of any person who in his opinion fails to comply with any conditions and restrictions endorsed on such licence, and the Director may restore such licence upon such terms as he considers appropriate.

# Validity of licence.

7. A licence issued under section 5 shall remain valid until the 31st day of December next following the date of issue and may be renewed annually on payment of the prescribed fees.

# Display of licence.

- 8. (1) Every licence issued under this Act, shall be prominently displayed on the premises of a licenced fermentary or cocoa dealer, as the case may be, by the holder thereof.
  - (2) The holder of a licence for a fermentary or a licenced cocoa dealer who uses any vehicle in his business shall prominently display on such vehicle the number of the licence and such other information as the Minister may prescribe.

# Prices to be displayed.

9. Every licenced cocoa deeler shall prominently display to the public at his place of business the current prices being offered for caceo beans and or cocoa beans as the case may be.

#### PART 3 : VANUATU EXPORT COCOA

Standards of Vanuatu Export Cocos.

10. The standard for Vanuatu Export Cocoa shall be based on accepted international standards and shall be prescribed by the Minister.

# Examination by Cocoa Inspector of beans intended for export.

11. Cocoa beans intended for export shall be submitted for examination to a Socoa Inspector who shall issue a certificate in the prescribed manner therefor indicating whether or not the beans are of the prescribed Vanuatu Export Cocoa Standard and mark the bags in the prescribed form.

#### PART 4 : APPOINTMENT AND POWERS OF COCOA INSPECTORS

Appointment of Cocoa Inspectors.

- 12. (1) The Minister on the recommendation of the Director, may appoint Cocoa Inspectors by notice published in the Gazette.
  - (2) The Minister may at any time by notice published in the Gazette revoke the appointment of a Cocoa Inspector.

Powers of Cocos Inspectors.

It shall be lawful for a Cocoa Inspector to enter at all reasonable hours onto any land or into any building or upon any structure for the purpose of inspecting, grading and taking samples of cocoa beans or of doing such other things as may be necessary for the purposes of this Act.

Immunity of Cocoa Inspectors.

No proceedings shall lie against any Cocoa Inspector in respect of loss or damage caused by him by any act or omission arising out of or in the course of the exercise by him of the powers conferred on him under the provisions of this Act unless it is shown that any such loss or damage was caused maliciously or without reasonable cause or by reason of his negligence.

#### PART 5 : MISCELLANEOUS

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Appeals against a decision of the Director or Cocoa Inspector.

- 15. (1) Appeal against any decision of the Director made under this Act lies to the Minister.
  - (2) Appeal against any decision of a Cocoa Inspector made under this Act lies to a Cocoa Appeals Committee established under section 16.
  - (3) An appeal under subsection (1) or (2) shall be submitted in writing to the Minister or the Cocoa Appeals Committee, as the case may be, within 30 days from the date of the decision appealed against.
  - (4) The Minister or the Cocos Appeals Committee, as the case may be, shall give their decision within a period not exceeding 15 days from receiving the appeal and their decisions shall be final and not subject to review by any Court.

Cocoa Appeals Committee.

- 16. (1) The Minister shall by Order published in the Gazette constitute Cocoa Appeal Committees consisting of a chairman and two members appointed by the Minister as follows:
  - (a) a representative of the department of Agriculture, chairman;
  - (b) two representatives of cocos growers, members.
  - (2) The Minister on appointing a member under subsection (1) shall nominate an alternate to such member who shall act during such member's temporary absence or inability to attend, whether or not such member is outside Vanuatu, and whether or not such inability is due to illness or other incapacity.

(3) The Minister may prescribe the rules of procedure to be followed by Cocoa Appeal Committees.

- (offences.
- 17. (1) Any person who contravenes sections 3, 8 or 9 is guilty of an offence.
  - (2) Any person who -
    - (a) obliterates, tempers with, or removes a prescribed inspection mark on a cocom bag;
    - (b) adds to, removes from, or in any other manner tempers with the contents of a marked cocoa bag without the approval of a cocoa inspector;
    - (c) makes any unauthorized alteration or deletion to any certificate issued by a Cocoa Inspector;

is guilty of an offence.

(3) Any person who hinders or obstructs a Cocoa Inspector in the performance of his duties or in the exercise of his powers under the Act is guilty of an offence.

- Penaltiss.
- 18. (1) Any person convicted of an offence under section 17 is liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding VT 100.000 or imprisonment not exceeding six months or to both.
  - (2) The Court may in addition to the punishment provided in subsection (1) order the forfeiture of any beans with regard to which the offence was committed.

- forders.
- The Minister may by Brear published in the Gazette make such regardions as may be necessary for carrying out the provisions of this Act, and may prescribe anything that way be prescribed.
- (Commencement.
- This Act shall come into force on such day as the Minister may appoint by Order published in the Gazette and the Minister may appoint different days for the coming into force of different provisions of this Act.
