## An Ordinance

made by the Administrator of the Territory of Western Samoa with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of that Territory, and in pursuance of the Samoa Act, 1921.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Building Alignment Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1922.
2. The Building Alignment Ordinance Amendment Ordinance 1921 is hereby repealed.
3. Notwithstanding anything in the Building Alignment Ordinance 1921 (hereinafter called the principal Ordinance,) the Administrator may approve of any plan submitted to him for approval under Clause 2 (1) of the principal Ordinance although such plan provides in the case of the street called Saleufi Lane for a less width than 20 metres, if such plan provides for a width of at least 10 metres for the said Saleufi Lane.
4. (1) Any plan prepared by the Chief Surveyor though not exclusively for building alignment purposes, shall upon approval by the Administrator under Clause 2 (2) of the principal Ordinance be deemed to be the official building alignment plan.  
(2) The official building alignment plan may consist of a number of sheets each of which shall be approved by the Administrator.  
(3) The approval of the Administrator to any such sheet may be limited to any street or part of a street specified in such approval notwithstanding that other streets may be shown on such sheet.
