## AN ORDINANCE

made by the Administrator of the Territory of Western Samoa with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of that Territory, and in pursuance of the Samoa Constitution Order, 1920:

- 1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Importation of Fruit from Fiji Prohibition Ordinance, 1920.
- 2. This Ordinance shall come into operation on the day of the date hereof.
- 3. Any person who imports or brings, or assists in importing or bringing into the Territory of Western Salos from any of the Islands of the Fiji group any fruit or plant whatever whether grown or landed in that group shall be guilty of an offence punishable by a fine not exceeding £20. The term "fruit" means and includes for the purposes of this Ordinance the edible product of any plant and the peel skin or shell of such product and the seed of any plant having an edible product. The term "plant" means and includes for the purposes of this Ordinance any tree, flower, shrub, vegetable, or other yegetation, whether growing or not.
- 4. The having of any fruit or plant on board a vessel in the port of Apia shall not be deemed to be a breach of the provisions of clause 3 hereof, provided such fruit or plant is not landed in Samoa.
